**WHAT COUNCIL DID**  
**Councillor Apologizes For Hardware Remarks**  
Apology for a statement at last week's council meeting was made Monday by Cr. Ern Hyde, who had questioned the status of hardware stores during a discussion on a request by hardware and appliance stores to be included in the Monday closing regulations.  
Solicitor John Ord, representing Mrs. Elizabeth McCrae, protested Mr. Hyde's comments concerning her business, Girdwood Hardware, and said his client felt the statement had hurt her business.  
"The store carries a full line of builders' supplies and household hardware; and Mrs. McCrae feels that a retraction should be made said Mr. Ord.  
Cr. Hyde said he had had no intention of hurting anyone's business and that he apologized for any trouble he might have caused.  
"It was a figure of speech I was using," he said, "and I guess the interpretation of the word hardware is strictly a matter of opinion."  
A by-law amendment was passed later in the meeting, in which the hardware and appliance stores will now be subject to Monday closing and all-day-Thursday opening, similar to a majority of Georgetown stores.  
Taxi operator Oliver Brownridge appeared to ask how many hours a person is entitled to park in front of one of the new parking meters, which he referred to as "highway robbers."  
He said he noticed a car parked over an hour in front of his office that day without putting any money in the meter.  
"They aren't meant as bandits," he was told by Cr. Harrison, "and are only meant for use when stores are open."  
A parking fee is not charged on Sunday and holidays, he said, and Monday is considered a holiday as a majority of downtown stores are closed.  
When Mr. Brownridge complimented councillors for standing up while speaking, he precipitated a discussion on the merits of standing and sitting.  
"I don't wish to be classed as ignorant, and I don't mean to be disrespectful to the chair, but I think it's awkward and foolish to us to be jumping up and down every time we speak," said Cr. Hyde who leads the "sitting" faction.  
"When I asked councillors to stand up when addressing delegations, I didn't mean it as an order," said Mayor Armstrong (seated). "I didn't intend it as an order. It is purely a personal thought and I'm not insisting that it be standard procedure."  
Possibility of using a yearly fee system for firms which use parking areas for loading and unloading was discussed. Brampton issues a permit for \$5 yearly, it was reported, and something similar might be useful here.  
Nomination meeting was set for Thursday, November 28th with location changed this year to Wrigglesworth school auditorium. Municipal elections will be on Monday, December 9th.

Meeting on Monday at the home of Mike O'Brien, a number of rules and regulations for the club were drawn by the new executive. Earl Little is committee chairman and Fred Young and Dave Jones, committee members.  
1. This dance is called "Teen Town" and shall be kept for teenagers only, so therefore the age limit is from 14 to 20 (the day of the 20th birthday).  
2. Entrance to dance will be permitted only by a membership card which will be free and can be obtained at the dance as of Oct. 4th, 1957 by filling in a pledge form.  
3. No alcoholic beverages will be allowed on the premises. No admittance to any person who is thought to be under the influence of alcohol by the management.  
4. Dress must be dresses or skirts for girls and suits or slacks for boys. Positively no form of jeans to be allowed on floor.  
5. No smoking permitted.  
6. No person allowed on the raised platform, except by permission of the management. No records will be touched except by person designated by the management.  
7. No heavy boots to be allowed on floor.  
8. The set price for entrance to the dance is 50c per person or \$1.00 per couple. Compulsory membership becomes effective Friday, October 4th, 1957.
