The men and boys of Canada's protestant churches have been challenged to strive for a richer Christ-centred life through the recommended boys' programs of the churches.

This objective was set at the conclusion of a recent four-day conference of some 50 key church and boys' work leaders from across Canada held at the Geneva Park YMCA Leadership Camp on Lake Couchiching.

The conference was the first of its kind in Canada. Its major concern was for the individual boy and how the church can meet his needs wherever he may live, whether in city, town or rural areas.

The delegates reported a steady growth in every section of Canada in the new Christian Education programs of churches, Yyvo, Sigma-C and Tuxis, for boys between the ages of 9 and 17.

The leaders also noted a marked resurgence of interest and vitality of the whole lay movement of the church in this phase of work, a new interest which poses the greatest possibilities for Christian Education for boys in the history of the church.

In its closing stages the conference called on the church to launch a National Christian Education Advance to place before its members the need for new concern and action to help Canadian youth follow the teachings of Christ.

Representatives of the 9 Older Boys' Parliaments held across Canada each year were also present at the conference and plans were laid by them for exchange visits among their members on a move to broaden and improve their parliaments.

AVERTS SERIOUS ACCIDENT WHEN CAR ROLLS DOWN HILL
Two small children were lucky to escape serious injury Saturday afternoon when the car in which they waited for their mother rolled from its parking spot on the west side of Main Street opposite First Baptist church to collide with a car owned by Dr. Ormond Brewster parked near his office in the Norton building at the corner of Main and Cross Streets. The alertness of a bystander prevented the car from a second collision and possible harm to its occupants.

Mrs. C. W. Gibson of 18 Sarah Street had left her car parked on the hill while she went across to the pet shop to make a purchase for her children Debbie Lee, age 2, and Wayne, age 3, who she left in the car, making sure that the emergency brake was on. When she came out of the store she found the car in front of the Brewster office at the bottom of the hill, where it had collided with the doctor's car. One of the youngsters had apparently released the brake.

Doug Norton of 34 Thomas St. Brampton, saw the car coasting down the hill from the Maveal garage where he was getting gas, and though too late to stop it from hitting the Brewster car, jumped in and applied the brake in time to keep it from hitting another vehicle parked immediately ahead.

Total damage was approximately \$150. Cpl. Bilsborrow investigated.
