Courses will consist of 12 two-hour lessons which will be given on Tuesdays or Wednesdays. Classes will begin on October 22nd and 23rd at 8 p.m. and will be held each following week until December 3rd and 4th. They will recommence January 14th and 15th, and continue until February 11th and 12th.

The basic fee for each course is \$5.00. \$2.00 must be forwarded with the application form, and the balance paid at the first lesson attended. Students who wish to take two courses will send two application forms, one for each, and will forward a total of \$4.00.

x The course in Public Speaking will consist of seven classes instead of twelve, and will be completed before Christmas. The basic fee will remain \$5.00.

* Welding students will pay an additional fee of \$10.00, above the basic fee.

* Drama Workshop - an additional fee of \$5.00 will be required.

* All Sewing and Tailoring classes: an additional fee which will not exceed \$2.00 may perhaps be charged, due to the fact that new, necessary equipment for these classes is being bought.

Physical Education (Square Dancing): a small additional fee may be charged.

* Contract Bridge: An additional fee of \$5.00 will be charged.

In all instances students will pay for costs of materials, and the necessary tools.

A minimum of 15 applicants must apply for each class.

Applicants must be 16 years of age or over. The committee reserves the right to carry or cancel any class.

REV. G. M. YOUNG WAS OAC PADRE'S FATHER

A Presbyterian minister for more than 50 years, Rev. G. M. Young of Forest died in Guelph on Saturday. He was 82. His son, Rev. W. A. Young who is padre of Ontario Agricultural College is well-known in this district, and has on several occasions been speaker at meetings of various agricultural clubs.

A native of Belmont, Mr. Young graduated from Knox College, Toronto in 1902 and was a missionary in the Canadian West in pioneer days. He served Ontario congregations in Lorneville, Kemble, London, Chippewa, Toronto, Ancaster, South Kinloss, Thorndale and Cromarty. In recent years he had lived in Forest.

He leaves his wife, Elena Attwood; two sons, Rev. W. A. Young, Guelph and Rev. M. C. Young, Gananoque; two daughters, Mrs. G. F. Gibson, Burlington and Mrs. G. E. Wilson, Kingston.

FAMOUS CANADIAN ARTIST IS VISITOR IN GEORGETOWN

Ranked among the top Canadian artists, Frederic Steiger was a visitor in town last week-end. He was a guest of Mr. and Mrs. Alex Reader, 10 Parkview Blvd.

One of only 30 Canadians listed in "Who's Who in Art" published in London, England, Mr. Steiger is a resident of Toronto. He is a painter of both portraits and landscapes. He has particularly specialized in landscapes of Newfoundland, the former home province of the Readers, and was commissioned by the Newfoundland government to make an extensive painting tour of the country.

A Canadian resident since 1922, he is self taught and has been painting for 18 years. He has had showings at all the main Canadian art galleries, won the bronze medal offered in 1941 by International Machines Corp. for his painting, "Courage".

His work has been reproduced in magazines in Austria, France and numerous journals and magazines.

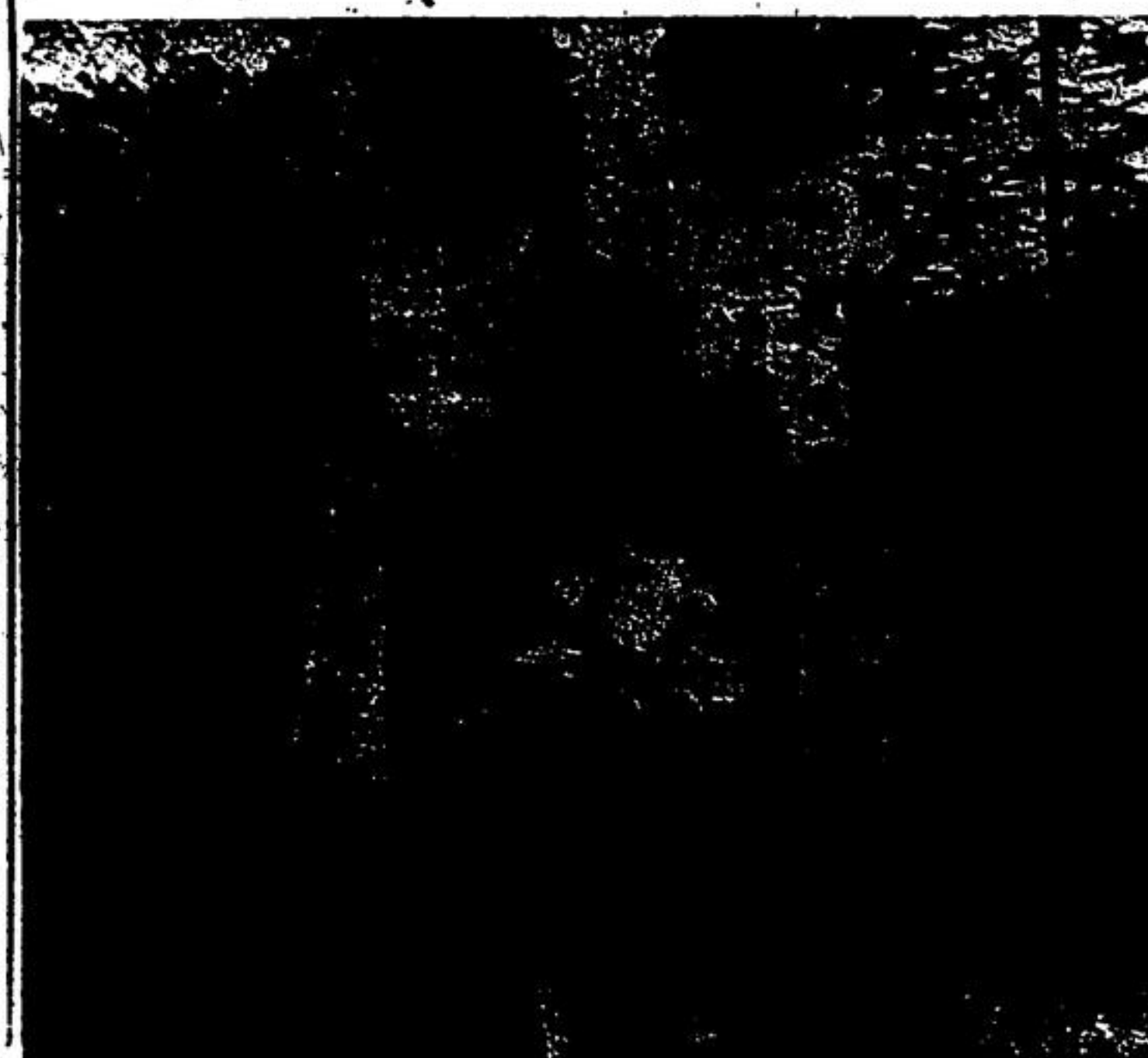
