School Pupils Visit New Sykes Tool Plant

Grade 7 students from Harrison Public School, with their teacher, Logan MacDonald had a tour of the new plant of Sykes Tool Corporation, Ltd. on Monday afternoon.

Jack Pennock, company manager, and other officials of the plant showed the young people the intricacies of gear making which, along with the production of the actual machinery for making gears, is the company's chief business at present.

The company, first to locate in the Delrex industrial subdivision, came to Georgetown last spring, purchasing a partially completed plant which, Delrex Developments had built on the highway. A Canadian subsidiary of W. E. Sykes, Ltd., whose factory is in Staines, Middlesex, England, the company, moved here from Montreal, where it had outgrown capacity of a plant established there a few years ago.

All departments of the business are now located in Georgetown, with a sales office maintained in Montreal. The Georgetown plant, located on over five acres of ground adjoins the B.A. Service Station towards the eastern boundary of town. It manufactures specialized gear-making machines for the domestic and U.S. market, also making gears to order for firms which do not require their own production departments.

After Monday's tour, Rex Heslop Jr. on behalf of his classmates, thanked Mr. Pennock for allowing them to visit the plant and see Georgetown's newest industry in action.
