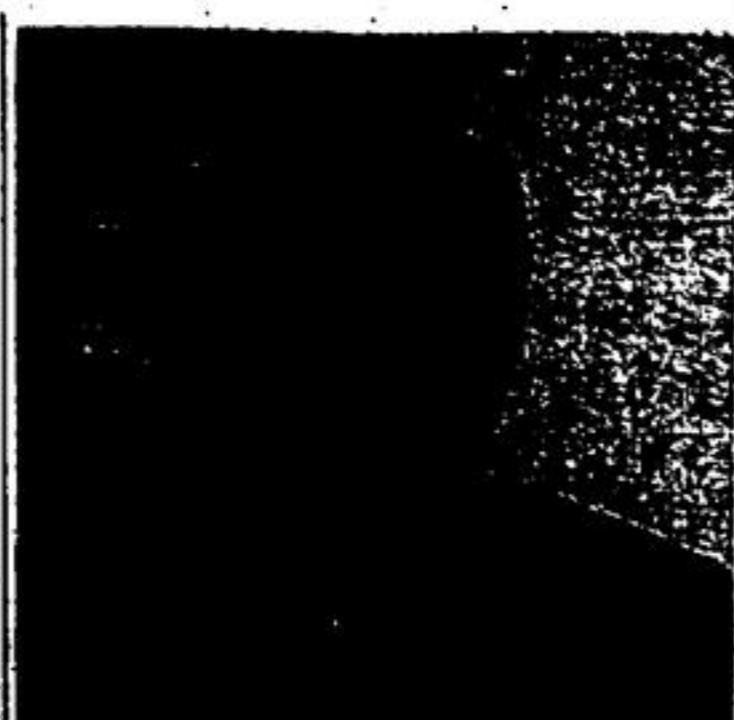

CARS DAMAGED IN HIGHWAY ACCIDENT

Poor road conditions contributed to a collision on Guelph St. last Thursday afternoon opposite the Sunoco Service Station. One of the drivers, William Thompson of 6 Hewson Crescent, later proceeded to Dr. C. V. Williams' office to receive treatment for a possible cracked rib.

The accident occurred at about 5.10 when Mr. Thompson, who was driving east on the highway skidded on wet pavement while slowing to make a left turn into the Sunoco station. The driver of the west-bound vehicle Ronald Kells, 20 Cleaveholm, was unharmed in the collision.

Damage to the front end of the Thompson car was estimated at \$400 while damage to the left front fender of the Kells car amounted to about \$160. The investigating officer was Sgt. Harley Lowe.
