**TAIL-BONE DEFORMITIES**

The tail bone or coccyx is subject to a great number of physical abuses. One natural strain is child-birth. As the baby develops in the mother's uterus, many changes must take place. The pubic bones in front separate, and the ligaments holding the tail bone firmly in position become softened to allow a backward separation when the child is born. After birth when fusion takes place, this bone doesn't always reform in its proper position, resulting in pain when sitting on a firm chair or riding in a car. **War Vetrean, Famer James Ed. Cain Dies**

After a lengthy illness James Edward Cain died in Toronto Hospital on Sunday, November 24th. Although Mr. Cain had been ill for some years his death came suddenly. He was in his sixty-third year. Mr. Cain was a veteran of the First World War. 1915 to 1919 and from 1920 to 1923 he served with the R.C.M.P. in Regina, Saskatchewan. He was born in Cheltenham the son of Mary Stokes Cain and James Cain. He moved to the West and for thirty-three years was a farmer in Radville, Saskatchewan. He was a great fisherman and spent a great deal of his spare time at this hobby.

Two brothers and a sister are left to survive him, John of Georgetown, Wilbert of Sault Ste. Marie and Margaret of Georgetown. A brother and sister predeceased him, Robert Cain of Glen Williams, and Mary Jane Davidson, Georgetown. Rev. A. J. Barker of First Baptist Church conducted the funeral service at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home, 34 Edith Street, on Wednesday, November 27th. Starrett Leslie, George Fawcett, Joe Hall Sr., Clarence Vasey, William Merritt and Roy Wiggins were pallbearers. Interment was in Glen Williams Cemetery.

By January, all hospitals in this area including Toronto, will be operating in the scheme. Volunteers are still needed to help, both as nurses, general assistants and to help set the clinic up. A number of men are urgently needed to help move the equipment into the hall at approximately 12.30 the day of the clinic. Anyone who happens to be working shift work and is free for an hour that afternoon, could be a great help. It is many years since a clinic has been held in the Georgetown area and it is hoped that the response will be good.
