Anderson's Team New Leaders in Industrial Bowling

Important steps were taken by the board of North Halton high school district on Monday at a meeting in Acton.

On the strength of estimates of the public school inspectorate of future enrolment in high schools, the board voted to ask permission from the Dept. of Education to make additions to the three schools it administers, in Georgetown, Acton and Milton.

Acton requires another 4 rooms and Milton another 8, the board believes, and permission will also be sought to remove the old main building in Georgetown and replace it with a two-storey, 8-room structure. When additions were made to the Georgetown high school, the architectural plan was designed for this improvement.

These additions do not include any provision for future expansion in any of the three towns. Although major expansion is possible and quite likely to happen in each, the board feels that the wise course to follow is to provide for the evident needs at this time.

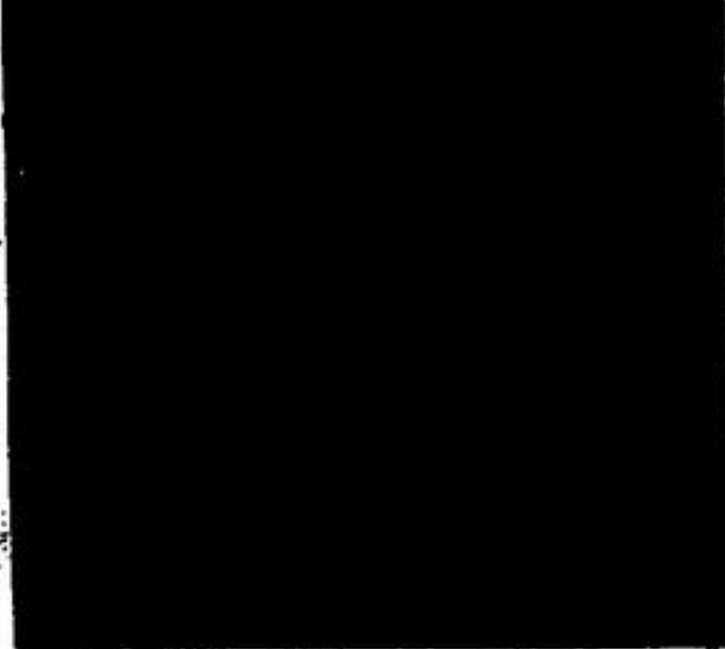
The province pays 70% to 75% of the cost of high school buildings, with the remainder being shared on an assessment basis by the three towns and Esqueving and Nassagaweya townships, which form the district. At present, Georgetown's share of such costs is 37%.

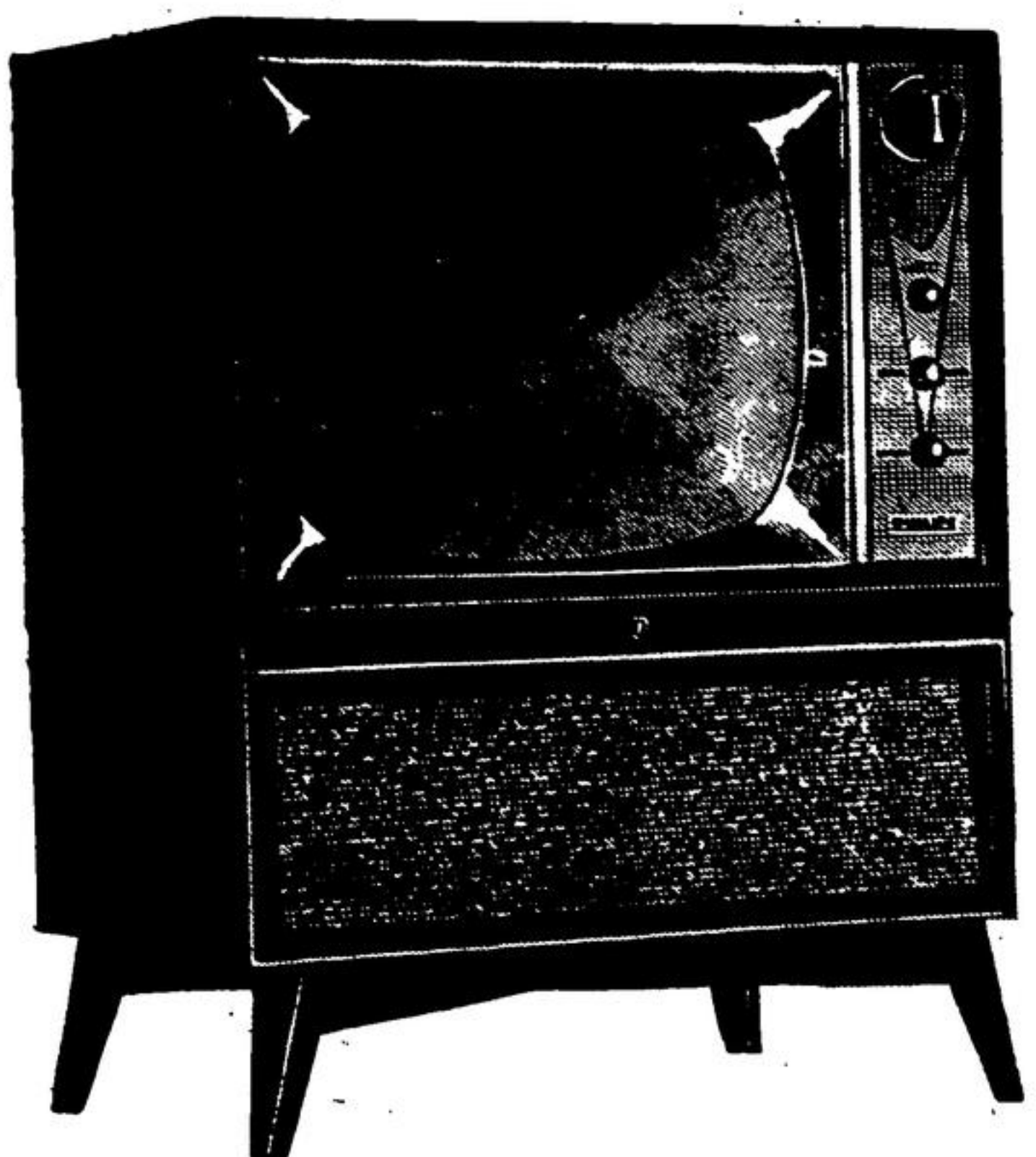
