Mid-Week Christmas Means More Long Distance Calls

With fewer people planning to travel home for a mid-week Christmas, a sharp increase in long distance holiday greetings is anticipated by the Bell Telephone Company.

L. G. Denby, Bell Telephone manager here, predicts that a record 2500 long distance calls to distant centres will originate here on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day—an increase of 400 calls over the same period last year. The flood of greeting that local residents will receive by telephone is also expected to reach a new high.

Months before Christmas telephone company experts begin studying calling figures and trends in order to determine where additional long distance service is most urgently needed for the current Christmas. This year the problem is complicated because, for the first time since 1948, December 25 falls on a Wednesday and an unprecedented upswing of calls is expected over the mid-week holiday period.

Besides the enormous load of calls being made to communities across Canada and the United States, an all-time record of overseas calls from all parts of Canada have been arranged by previous appointment, through the Bell Telephone's overseas switchboard, located in Montreal. Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and Boxing Day are being booked to the full capacity of 40 calls per hour.

representing an increase of 250 per cent in calls over the similar three-day period in 1956.

Calls to several European countries are scheduled for December 24, where Christmas Eve is celebrated more than Christmas Day. Calls to England are booked heavily for Boxing Day, the day following Christmas Day, and calls to Scotland have been requested for the popular "Hogmanay" or New Year's Eve celebration.

The telephone company suggests that calls to points in the Maritimes, Western Canada and the United States be made before or after Christmas Day, to help avoid delays caused by the unusual pattern of Yuletide calling. Normally, most long distance calls are between the larger centres, but at Christmas the greater proportion of calls are to and from smaller communities and the more remote centres, where there are fewer circuits.

However, there should be less of a problem on the week ends before and after Christmas, and chances of getting through on the afternoon of Christmas Eve are better than later in the evening. The load is also somewhat lighter after midnight.

Mr. Denby offered the following tips to avoid delays and speed up handling of calls: Call by number and eliminate the time required to contact "Information" in the called city; make station-to-station calls and try to arrange in advance for your party to be home; if the circuits are busy or the call is not answered, place the call again yourself rather than asking the operator to check at intervals and report to you.
