



Safety Officers Warn Be Careful With Christmas Trees

tree than on it. It looked more like a hall rack than a Christmas tree." "That was probably a spruce," the forester replies. It had been cut probably three weeks before you bought it. I've always tried to get a balsam fir or pine because the needles hang on so much better. If it's a spruce, make sure it

hasn't been cut too long." "How do you tell the difference between pine, balsam, fir and spruce?"

"A pine always has two or more needles in a place on the twig; basam and spruce occur singly. Balsam needles are flat and will slide between your thumb and forefinger. Spruce needles are four-sided and tend to roll. The spruce needle is sharp-pointed and prickly; balsam is rounded and more pli-

Popularity of the various types locality to some extent. In eastern and northern Ontario, baisam, fir. and spruce are common, and, until recent years, were the most popular in southern Ontario also. Since 1946, pine has been appearing in increasing numbers in Toronto, Hamilton and Windsor.

Scotch, red and white pine are used. Scotch pine from plantations being the most important. The pines retain their needles better than spruce and so can be cut as early as Nov. and shipped considerable distances. Heavy snowfall in December interferes with moving the trees to market.

Lands and Forests officials are incline dto attribute the Scotch pine's popularity also to its 6 or TRiangle 7-3452 7 years growing time and to its long popularity in Europe where it is quite common.
