The contest sponsored by Halton County Fire Prevention Bureau, (which consists of eight fire departments in Halton County) was judged by Miss Dorothy Stone, R. R. 3, Alexander "Sandy" Best, M.P., R.R. 2, Georgetown, and Jack Gowland, Brampton Fire Chief. Desk pen sets were presented to the winners, by Georgetown Fire Chief Jack Harlow, and Georgetown fireman Bill Hyde, on behalf of the Bureau. Trophies, donated by Halton Union Farmers Mutual Fire Insurance Company, were presented by Craig Reid and Jim Fisher, representatives of the company, to teachers Mrs. Edna Beaumont (Glen Williams) and Miss Wilma Stull (Georgetown). These trophies are presented yearly for competition, to the schools that have winners in the contest. A. E. "Babe" Clement, Milton, chairman of the Fire Prevention Bureau, welcomed all the guests to the presentation and dinner. Outlining the history of the Mutual Aid System, Fire Chief, Clement told the guests and members of the Bureau of the foresight of two or three men in the Oakville area, who could foresee the benefit of a Mutual Aid Fire System, whereby no community in Halton County would be left without fire protection at any time, and neighboring departments would be able to assist each other. "I feel quite proud, that Halton County has started something of great service and am happy to say that all other counties in Ontario have followed our pattern by starting the Mutual Aid System" stated the chairman. Mr. Clement pointed out the Fire Prevention Bureau was inaugurated this year in conjunction with the Mutual Aid System. "It is our hope to make Halton County safe from fire" continued the speaker. The chairman congratulated the winners on the splendid interest

Thanks was expressed to all other contestants for taking part in the contest and to the judges for devoting their time in doing such a splendid job in judging the posters.

Out-of-town guests included Ralph McKeown, principal of Glen Williams School, and B. Sullivan, from the Fire Marshal's office.
