William Emmerson, 72 Veteran of Two Wars

Veteran of two wars, and a resident of Georgetown for 34 years, William Wade Emmerson, 72 died in Guelph General Hospital on December 27th.

Mr. Emmerson, once night constable and a security guard at Smith & Stone when he retired four years ago was born in England at Bitchfield, Durham. When he first came to town he was employed at the Alliance Paper Mill and later worked on the railway, then established his own trucking business. He served in the first war with the 8th Durham Light Infantry and in World War 2 with the local Lorne Scots regiment.

He was a member of Branch 120, Canadian Legion and was a past noble grand of Orion Odd Fellows Lodge. He was at one time a member of Loyal Orange Lodge 245.

Mr. and Mrs. Emmerson moved from their home on William St. a year ago to Hillsburgh. He leaves his wife, Mary Young, and five children, Joseph, 89 Main St. N.; John, 16 Victoria Crescent; James, 20 Margaret St.; and William and Lorraine (Mrs. Stuart Puckering) of Hillsburgh. A daughter, Mary Jane died in England in childhood. He also leaves a brother Robert of West Stanley, Durham, 13 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. He was predeceased by two brothers, James and John of town.

Rev. George E. Wilson of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Hillsburgh conducted the funeral service on December 30th at the Harold C. McClure Funeral Home, Georgetown and interment was in Greenwood cemetery. Pallbearers were fellow Legionnaires Sam Tennant, Perc Chaplin, Jack Kerr, Jack Smith, Charles Day and Alex Taylor. On the Sunday evening, a Legion service was conducted at the funeral home.
