BURSITIS

This is a condition of middle age or older people, rarely occurring in the young. Frequently it is mistaken for rheumatism, until the pain and stiffness nearly incapacitates the patient. This disease is an inflammation of a bursa or sac located in the shoulder, heel, knee or elbow. The most common place of affliction is in the shoulder girdle. Truck drivers or laborers, or persons using their arms a great deal become the most susceptible persons. The pain may originate in the shoulder blade and run up the neck, causing a stiffness and soreness in the neck, or pain may radiate down the arm. This should be treated as soon as it is first noticed or permanent stiffness in the neck or shoulder may result.
