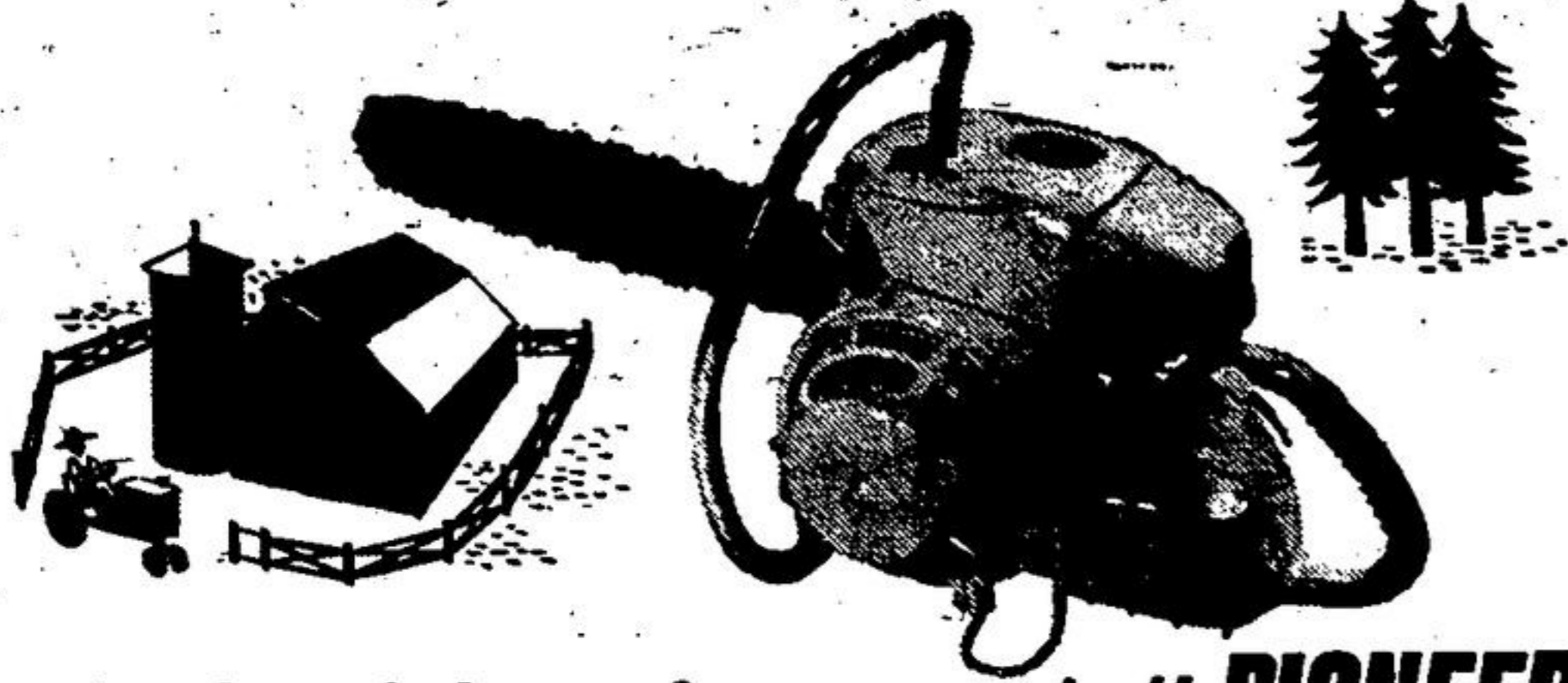

BRUCellosis CONTROL

As a result of the resolutions passed at recent annual meetings of the Halton Soil & Crop Improvement Association, and the County Guernsey, Holstein, and Jersey Clubs, recommending that Halton become a Brucellosis Control Area, the Halton Livestock Improvement Association has completed plans to hold a series of township meetings so that every cattle owner in the county may have an opportunity to familiarize himself with all aspects of the proposal.

Dr. Harold Worton, Provincial Veterinarian, was in attendance at all four meetings, to outline the proposed Brucellosis Control Area plan and its implications.
