CANCER SOCIETY HAS NEW HEADQUARTERS IN MILTON

North Halton unit of the Canadian Cancer Society convened in its new meeting place at the Milton town hall on Thursday. The members present from Georgetown, Acton and Milton were pleasantly surprised with the spaciousness of the large room which will serve a dual purpose for general meetings and welfare work.

There is ample room for the making of dressings and cupboard space for storing these. Through cooperation of Beaver Lumber and Mino Millwork, the Lions Club of Georgetown will donate two large tables for making dressings which will be supplied free to patients in North Halton. Any interested ladies who would like to volunteer for making these are asked to call Mrs. Ernie Alcott, Georgetown. The ladies meet in Milton monthly.

Under the chairmanship of Mr. Alcott, committees are being formed for the annual fund campaign in April. This is the only campaign of the society, and the public is urged to be generous in its donations in the crusade against cancer. Over 30,000 Canadians died from this dread disease last year and only through public interest can it be defeated. The annual Seed Display Day of the Halton Soil & Crop Improvement Association is scheduled for the Milton fair grounds on Saturday, March 22nd, states Maurice C. Beatty, president of the association. This will provide an opportunity for those with seed for sale to bring it before the buying public, adds Mr. Beatty. As in former years, only seed which is backed by government grade for purity and germination will be eligible for display purposes.

The program on Saturday morning will feature the Junior Farmers' Judging Competition in Cereals, Grains, Small Seeds, Potatoes, Weeds, etc., where there will be separate prize lists for Juniors, Intermediates and Seniors. A new feature of these judging competitions will be a special award to coach of the high team. Plans are also under way to line up two of the top agricultural speakers in the province for the afternoon programme.
