VISITATION, CHURCH EXPANSION DISCUSSED AT ANGLICAN VESTRY

Reporting for the stewardship and finance committee of St. George's Anglican Church, at the annual vestry meeting on January 28th, Douglas Meades, 72 Rexway Drive, urged an every-member visitation this spring. His suggestion met with favour at the meeting and plans will be made for this to take place.

In his talk at the meeting for which he was chairman, Rev. Kenneth Richardson stressed the challenge ahead for a church congregation in a growing town. He pointed out the inadequacy of accommodation for Sunday School and other allied church activities, and said thought must be given to expansion of the church both physically and spiritually. A building committee is working on long-range plans for this, and parishioners must be looking ahead to the day when the church will have a proper parish hall, he said.

The meeting followed a service of evensong in the church. Thomas Parry, 177 Main St. N., was elected people's warden and Mr. Richardson appointed Jack Meades, 60 McIntyre Crescent, as people's warden. Lay delegates to synod, Thomas Eason, 19 Byron St., Jack Armstrong, 23 Parkview Blvd. and Ernie Barnes, Ballinafad were re-elected, as were the substitutes, Walter Biehn, 26 Queen St. and Mr. Parry. The retiring wardens, Charles Harris Mountain view Road and Sam Pearce, Glen Williams were named to the advisory board. Other members contin-

ing in office on this board are Jim Costigan, 29 Market Street, Thomas Van Sicker, 43 Shelley Street, Bob Borland, 6 Cleaveholm, and Irwin Noble, 118 Guelph Street.

Mr. and Mrs. Wallace Thompson, 14 Church St. will continue as auditors.

In presenting the church statement, Sam Pearce, pointed to the installation of a new pipe organ as a major work of the year. A \$2,000 payment to the diocese apportionment fund will be increased by 10 per cent this year.

Mrs. Ron Edwards, 35 Queen St., reported for the Women's Auxiliary and Mrs. Larry Maughan, 71 Sargent Road for the Daughters of the Church. Douglas Meades, who is superintendent of the Sunday School reported for that department which showed an increase of 34 per cent in attendance. Bob Borland reported for the Brotherhood of Anglican Churchmen, and Thomas Parry for the 2nd Georgetown Scout Troop.

It was decided to have a church treasurer next year and Walter Pope, 97 Maple Ave. W., will fill this position. Mrs. Thomas Eason retired as envelope secretary, and John Walker, 32 Park Ave. will look after this in 1958. Lloyd Kinnersely, 15 Shelley St., was elected convener of sidesmen, with Irwin Noble as assistant.

A substantial salary increase was voted to the rector. The church is also planning in its 1958 budget to add the present stipend paid to the rector by St. Alban's, Glen Williams, when that church becomes a single parish this year. Wallace Thompson acted as vestry clerk for the meeting and after adjournment, ladies of the W.A. served refreshments.

CO-OP MEDICAL WILL STAY IN BUSINESS

"Stay in business" was the unanimous decision of the members of the Halton Co-operative Medical Services at the eleventh annual meeting, when they learned that their association would have to vacate the field of hospital insurance when the Hospital Services Commission of Ontario goes into operation on January 1st, 1958. Because the government benefits will not cover surgical or medical costs the members felt the association could still offer a service and gave the board of directors power to improve and promote contracts to cover surgical and catastrophe benefits.

"Although hospital claims have continued to rise, the increase in premiums effective early in the year enabled us to close the financial year with a small surplus," stated Miss Florence Meares, president, in her chairman's remarks.
