Attendance, Finance Increase Noted at Grace Baptist Annual

Two nights were devoted to annual celebrations by the members and friends of Grace Baptist Church in Georgetown. On the night of January 23 over 50 sat down to supper in the Oddfellows Hall at 6.30 p.m. prepared by the ladies of the congregation.

After an excellent repast, the pastor, Mr. Bruce Penny led in a session of lively gospel singing, beginning at 7.50 p.m. After invocation, he read from the passage found in Philippians chapter 3, verses 1 to 14, and based his remarks on this chapter.

Reports given by the heads of many departments of the work showed very encouraging progress over the year 1957. Special mention was made of the Sunday School picnic and the Christmas concert by the superintendent. Reports were also given by the treasurer, the church clerk and young people's president. The pastor's wife, Mrs. Penny reported on the work of the Dorcas Woman's Circle, stating that they had heard several special missionary speakers, had sent six boxes overseas to missionaries, two boxes of used clothing to Yonge St. Mission in Toronto, and one box of Christmas gifts to a home mission family.

In the Sunday School report, it was noted that about 72 families have been supporting the work, with an average attendance of 85 and a high record attendance for the year of 104. About 14 classes are enrolled, about 130 are on the roll. Almost all classes send substantial amounts from their banks to mission fields in many parts of the world. The Young People have 27 on the roll and an average attendance of 18.

According to the pastor's report, the average attendance at all services, including cottage prayer meetings, has been very good. This year has seen one conversion and four baptisms. The church clerk reported an increase of 50 per cent in membership during the past year, and well over 50 percent attendance at communion services. The treasurer reported an increase of almost 100 per cent in church finances, and the givings to missions are also greatly increased.

Four items of business were passed, four new members were also received into fellowship. All heard testimonies of God's goodness and of His saving and keeping power from these four new members. All business was not completed, but after the singing of the doxology, the pastor closed in prayer.

The second portion of annual meetings of Grace Baptist Church

was held on the night of January 30th, in the home of the pastor, Mr. Bruce Penny. After devotions centered around Colossians 1: 1 - 18 and Ephesians 1: 22, 23 "That Christ might have the pre-eminence." The business session of the meeting began with the reading and accepting of the clerk's minutes. About ten new motions were carried during the course of the evening. The lot situation was reviewed and left over till the church board meeting on Monday, Feb. 3rd.
