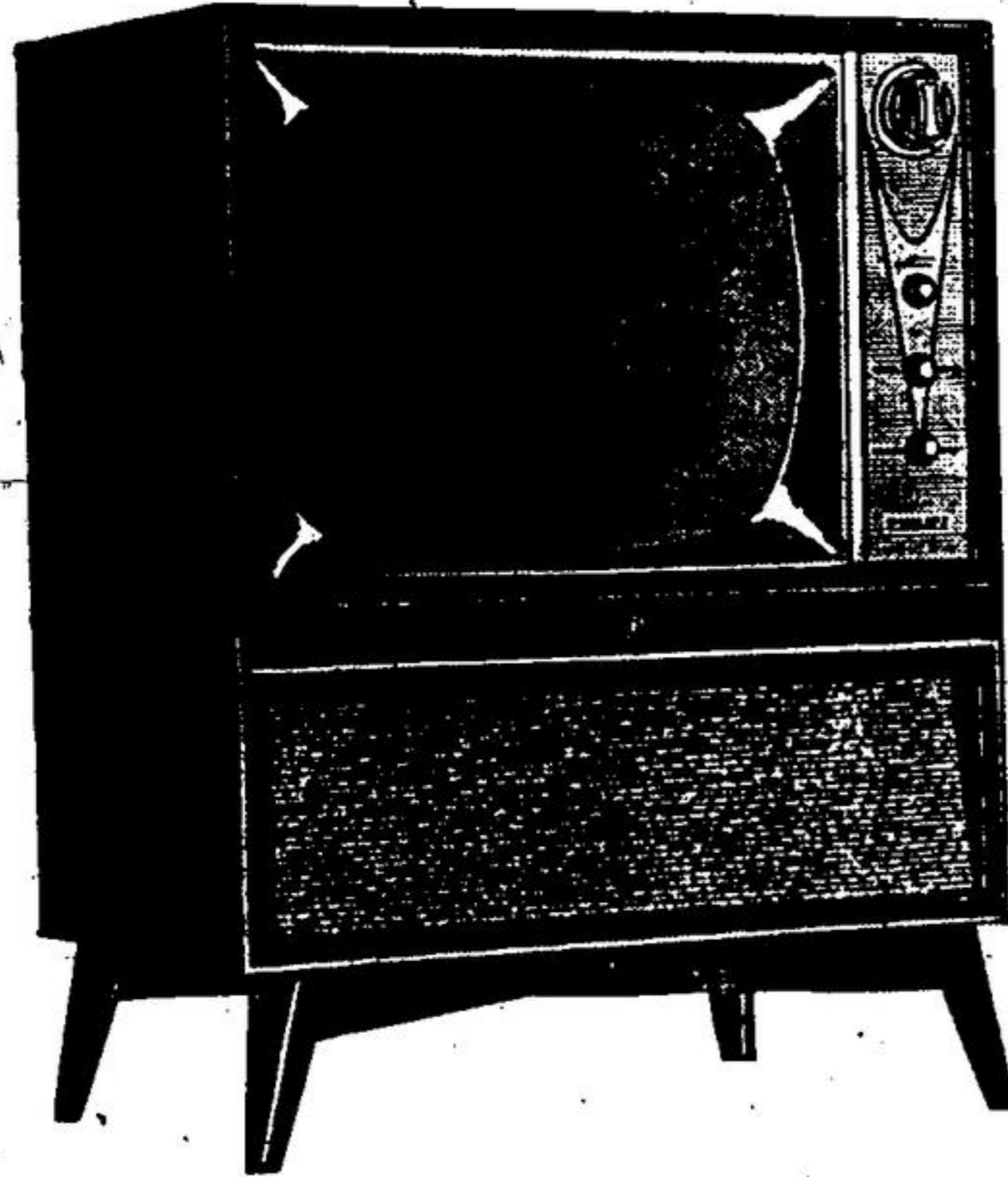

### EXPLAINS LAW POINTS CONCERNING CHILDREN

At the Chapel Street Home and School Association meeting on February 3rd Magistrate Kenneth Langdon explained a number of points of law concerning children. Some of the listeners were surprised to find that it is illegal to give your own child, under 21, an alcoholic drink in one's own home. Mr. Langdon spoke at length on teenage drinking and said that many of his cases dealt with young people apprehended for drinking.

A warning was issued to storekeepers by the magistrate who stated it is illegal to sell cigarettes to anyone under age of 16. He felt that the only solution was to make an example of one store keeper by enforcing the seldom enforced law.

Mr. Langdon caused quite a stir among the parents when he said it is illegal for any child under 16 to be in a public place after 9:00 p.m. without parents or guardian. This includes the arena, theatre, etc.

A lively question period followed the magistrate's interesting talk and refreshments were served at the close.
