

AURORA CRUMBLES JUNIOR DEFENCE TO WIN 8 - 5

Aurora Bears showing plain old fashioned determination battered away at Georgetown Junior Raiders defensive wall until it came tumbling down midway through the third period Friday night to gain an 8 to 5 victory and set the J.R.s record at a dismal 2 and 8 with just three games left in the schedule.

An indication of the bombardment that Lockhurst took are the shots on goal which totalled 50, 16 in the first, 25 in the second, and only 9 in the third which oddly enough was the local's most disastrous period. Georgetown got to Child's in the Aurora net 33 times.

With Pomeroy and Doug Richardson out of Friday's lineup

coach Bill Chard started with McLean, Ward and Harrison, shifting Glen Dance, the only remaining member of regular first line back on defense. Dance was later worked back up front as Chard tried various combinations in an effort to get at least one line that could go both ways. Georgetown's backchecking was almost nil.

The Jr. Raiders had the lead twice in the game, once in the first period and again in the 3rd, and it was Ross Turner who put them out in front both times.

The opener was scored from close in when Baxter fed to Turner at the goal mouth at 15.27 just 8 seconds before Olliver beat Lockhurst on a solo rush at 15.35. Olliver was also in on Aurora's

go-ahead tally scored by McKinnon about a minute later on a play touched off by Davis, while Bob Cox was serving a hooking penalty.

Rutledge put the Bears two up at 2.50 of the second period from McGuinnis and Browning.

Lockhurst passed his biggest test around the 5 minute mark when he turned aside a dozen or more shots while Dance warmed the penalty box after elbowing Davis.

A pair of tallies by Ron McLean pulled the J.R.s even. He was on a line with Ross Cunningham and Bill Richardson when he got his first one on a rebound at 10.10 and was with Ward on his second marker just 40 seconds later. His second was the better of the two and one of the best of the night.

Ward started McLean away on a break; but with just the goalie to beat from the blue line in he par-

tially lost control of the puck and let it get ahead of him. Childs, a little over anxious, left his crease and started out for the pill, McLean just reached ahead and deflected it by the Aurora goalie and to the open net.

Rutledge teamed with McGuinnis for his second of the period at 12.40. McGuinnis had the first try, Lockhurst blocked his shot, but left a rebound for Rutledge who made it 4-3.

Aurora had the odd man when Baxter and Cox clicked for the equalizer at 16.50. They were killing off a penalty to Ward at the time.

Turner brought the crowd to their feet when he put the Jr. Raiders ahead for the second time at eleven minutes of end to end hockey in the final period. It was the kind of play penalized players think about while they're serv-

ing their sentence. Turner, who had just completed a kneeling penalty, took possession of the puck as soon as he hit the ice, romped in and scored.

What first appeared as an occasional mental lapse on the part of the defence in the early stages of the game grew to gaping holes in the last half of the final period as Aurora punctured the Georgetown rear wall almost at will. Sampson sunk a pair to complete his hat trick while McKinnon added singles to run the Aurora total to 8.

McKinnon, Sampson, Cook and Rutledge, looked best for the Bears, McLean, Harrison, Baxter, Turner, and Lockhurst stood out for Georgetown.
