**GEORGETOWN SENIORS SNEAR ACTON 140**

On Tuesday, February 4th the two high school teams from Georgetown defeated the two teams from Acton by a total aggregate of 16 to 0. The juniors waded into a hard fought game and emerged the victors by the score of 2 to 0. The goals were by J. Richardson and W. Wheeler.

The second game was the one which held the interest. It lasted a complete hour and an hour of more unequal hockey has never been played anywhere on the earth before. The goalie for Acton was literally in the midst of a blizzard of shots all through the game. The highest scorer was Kent Riddall who banged home six. The next on the list was Ron McLean who got five and the others were bagged by Ken Beam, Brian Lewis, and Paul Ward. The final score at the end of sixty minutes of play was a startling 13 to 0 for Georgetown. One big surprise came when Georgetown was honoured with the appearance of their star goal tender, "Gump" Butch Hyde, who during the first part of the game wasn't feeling so good so had to play defense. The three stars of Tuesday's game, were of course, Gump Hyde, Charlie Jewel, the regular, and quite talented netminder and Ron McLean, who was always in there digging. The next game will be some time next week, and will be on the playoff games.

The large number of kindergarten enrolments at both Harrison and Wrigglesworth public schools is contrasted by Chapel St. KP attendance of 28 in the morning and 27 in the afternoon. Details of the shift were left to the principals.

Wrigglesworth presently has the largest total enrolment, 515; Harrison has 480 and Chapel 441.

Classes at Harrison public school have been on a staggered system since the first of the month. However, the method being used, with each grade being placed on the half day schedule for a period of only four weeks, was generally acknowledged by the board as one which would have the least possible effect on the pupils' education.

The new wing on Harrison public school which was to have been completed and accommodating classes before the end of this term will likely not be ready until after the summer holidays it was learned by the board at last Wednesday's meeting. The probable extension of the completion date is attributed to the difficulty in acquiring steel for construction. Possible tenders are being reviewed by the board at a special meeting tonight.

It was suggested by Harold Henry, principal of Harrison public school, that a folding wall be used between the two end rooms of the new wing to provide a hall which could be used for small assemblies and school activities which could not be put on in an ordinary classroom. The idea will be presented to J. B. Parkin Associates' architect, Bill Parkin, at tonight's meeting.

The board permitted rental of the Wrigglesworth auditorium to Georgetown High School and the Rotary Club for dates in March and April. The High School will be using the hall for their Star-dust Ball on March 7th and the Rotarians are presenting their annual minstrel show there three nights in April.
