Cst. Tom Dobbie has been assigned to duty at 'A' Division of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police following a pass-out ceremony at Rockcliffe barracks Friday attended by his parents Mr. and Mrs. Jim Dobbie, 10 Young St. and his sister and brother-in-law, Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Moody of Toronto.

'A' Division is located in Ottawa and Cst. Dobbie's duties there will deal with federal matters and will include guarding most of the important buildings including those on Parliament Hill, the Supreme Court Building, the Governor General's House, the Prime Minister's House and the Canadian Mint. He reported to 'A' Division at 2 p.m. Friday afternoon.

The pass-out ceremonies were held at the barracks at 9:30 Friday morning and consisted mostly of precision movements and physical training demonstrations, after which the Mounties entertained their parents and guests in the recreation room where refreshments were served. Introductions were made at this time and those passing out said goodbye to their fellow troop members and instructors.

INSTITUTES HOLD FIRST SUMMARY DAY IN ESQUEQUING

J. E. W. The Halton County home economist, Mabel Borgstrom, reports a gratifying response to the Women's Institutes' first Summary Day for the short course, "New Lamps for Old". This was held on Tuesday, January 28th, in the Esquequing Township Hall at Stewarville.

A new service provided by the Home Economic Service of the Department of Agriculture this year, was a system of local leader training schools on various topics, the leaders in turn being responsible for teaching the course in their own communities. "New Lamps for Old" was the choice for Halton, and seven Women's Institutes had their leaders trained and then carried on the course, which was chiefly the construction of lampshades of the cardboard or cloth-covered cardboard type.

This resulted in summary day in a beautiful display of custom-made lampshades showing originality and ingenuity in the use of construction materials and decoration.

Mrs. Wm. McIntyre, chairman of the local committee in charge of summary day, opened the programme with words of welcome, and called on Miss Jeanne Armour, home furnishings specialist from the Home Economics Service, and instructed for the leaders' training school, to present badges to the leaders and comment on their work.

Each leader also commented on her group's activities, describing materials and methods used, difficulties encountered and other matters of interest. While about thirty women have participated in the course so far, leaders are finding that interest is still growing and there is a likelihood that instruction will be carried on for some time. Also, those who attended summary day were so inspired by the ideas shown there that they went home determined to make many more shades.

A feature of the afternoon programme was a film entitled, "Bright Future", which illustrated the change that adequate lighting can make in homes and family living. Music was also provided in the form of very delightful vocal solos by Mrs. F. Thompson of Ashgrove, accompanied by Mrs. Frank Wilson.

Some consideration was given by the group to the choice of a course for Halton County next year, and it was decided to leave the decision to the Home Economics Service. One of the following will be assigned: Sew to Save Dollars and Make Sense; Hooked Rugs; Hints for the Home Nurse; the Third Meal. The training school will again be offered to Women's Institutes or any similar group who wish to participate.
