Three players did all the Norval scoring, Ross Cunningham leading the barrage with 6 goals while Bill Donaldson collected 3 and Bill Richardson got 3. Don Vivian surpassed Cunningham's mark by counting ten (10) goals, the others being added by Bob Marshall and Glenn Richardson.

Vivian rapped in all of the first period tallies as Palermo took a 4-3 lead after the first twenty minutes. Richardson scored twice and Donaldson once in this frame.

Both clubs counted three times in the second period, Vivian, Marshall and Vivian again for the Palermo and Donaldson for the Norval. Palermo failed to keep pace as Norval outlasted them 6-5 in the free scoring last stanza in which Ross Cunningham broke loose for all but one of the Norval markers that scored by Richardson.
