

Jack Henry, CCF Candidate Criticizes Slaughtering Methods

dressed a meeting in Georgetown month: on Saturday, March 8th and had this to say about the humane slaughter of animals:

ARE CANADIANS INHUMANE Canadians spent millions of dollars last year on their pets, keeping them warm, well-fed and in good health. They observed laws set up to protect their pets from mistreatement and cruelty. Yet, to provide meat for their tables during the same period of time, some 15 million, food animals suffered the most severe pain and torture in Canadian slaughter-

Incongruous, yes, but true! How is it that we, a normally kindhearted people, are so careful about the welfare and protection of our pets and yet so ignorant - if not callous - about the terrible pain and suffering inflicted upon food animals each year?

Is it because for years we have hidden behind the cracker barrel philosophy that what you don't know won't hurt you?
