Possibility of obtaining 70% Three daughters and two sons McMahon from McGuire and subsidy on wages of unemployed residents employed in sidewalk construction will be further in vestigated. A letter from the provincial government said this would be allowable, but cited a long list of conditions which have to be met and led Reeve Sargent to term the new provincial legislation "a beautiful sham."
