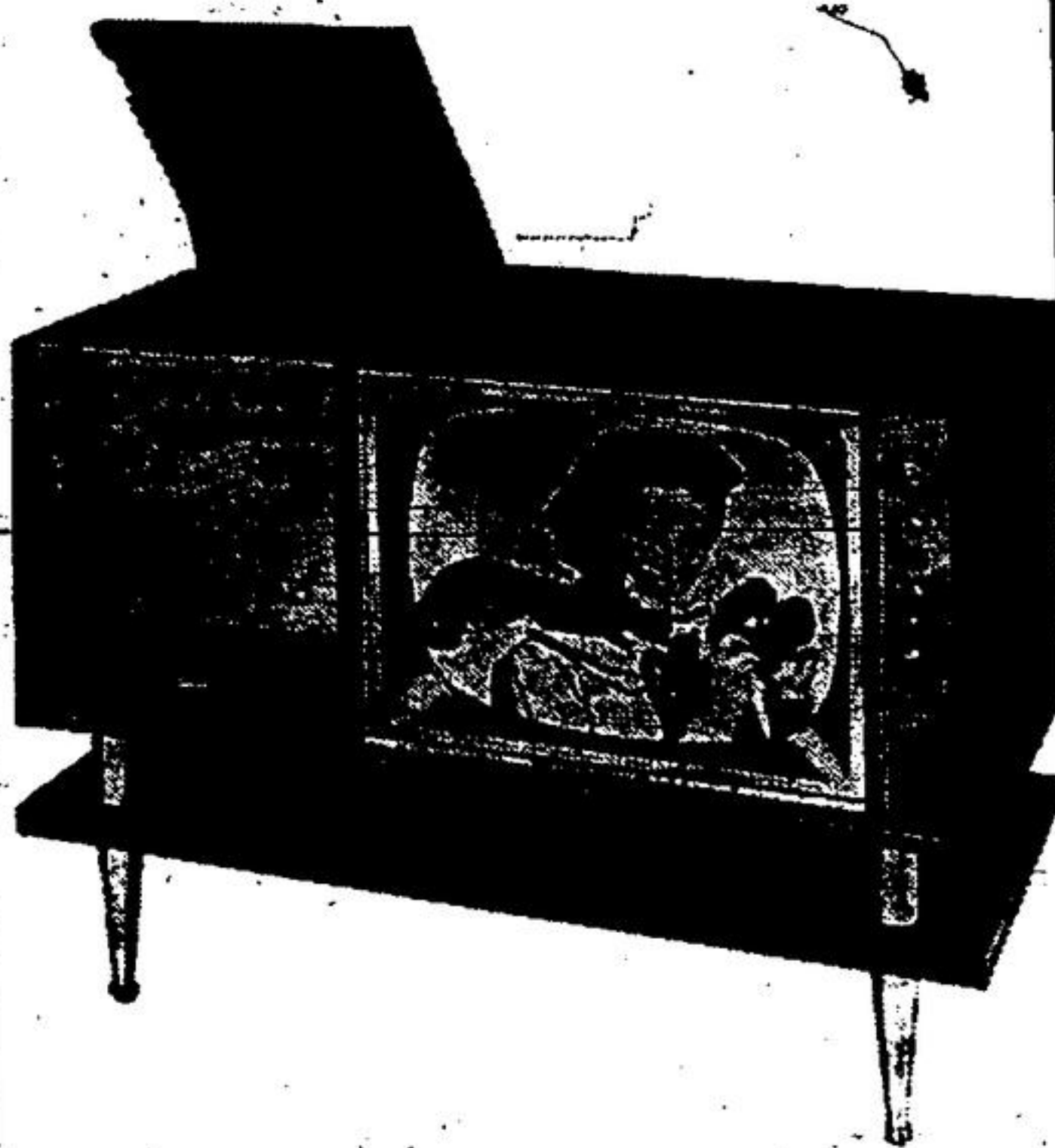
ATTEND SERVICE FOR GRADUATES AT O.A.C.
