## Indian Minister Tours Presbyterian Churches

An outstanding Christian leader is to be in the area from April 9th until April 16th in the person of Pastor Moti Lall, Jhansi, India. He will be visiting Presbyterian congregations in the district, and speaking to Lions Clubs, Kiwanis Clubs, Rotary Clubs, as well as public and high school students.

A heavy itinerary has been planned for Pastor Lall including Georgetown, Norval, Union, Boston, Omagh, Brampton, Limehouse, Bolton, Nashville, Milton, Streetsville, Woodbridge, Vaughn Township, Sixteen, On Sunday, April 13th, Moti Lall will commence the day with a visit to the Sabbath School of Brampton Presbyterian Church and will conclude the morning preaching at the service, after dinner he will journey to Union Presbyterian Church for the 1.30 hour to speak at the Sabbath School; thence to the Limehouse Presbyterian Church for the afternoon service at 2.30 p.m. At 5.30 p.m. he will be in Georgetown at Knox Church to dine with the Youth Groups and then at 7 p.m. he will speak to a meeting of the young people of the area.

Pastor Moti Lall is the senior pastor on the Jhansi Field in India where the Presbyterian Church in Canada maintains a mission station. For 25 years Pastor Lall has had oversight of the native work. He has been active in Evangelism throughout North India as well as in the Jhansi Church, and in teaching Catechists and Evangelists. He has come to Canada from 3 months of special evangelistic meetings in British Guiana, Surinam and Trinidad, as the guest of

the British Guiana Presbytery. According to one Niagara Falls newspaper, "The over-all impact of the man and his message did more for the cause of Christian missions than 100 sermons." According to one man in Sault Ste. Marie: "Once Pastor Moti Lall had spoken in one classroom all the teachers wanted

him: We had to 'tear him away' to his next engagement."  
Pastor Moti Lall is in Canada under the auspices of the General Board of Missions of the Presbyterian Church in Canada. His son, Stephen Moti Lall, will graduate from Knox College, Toronto, this year.

### DAUNT & BENNETT HAVE SHORTHORN CHAMPIONS

Members of the Royal Shorthorn Club, particularly from Halton, Peel and Wellington counties, provided the major share of the highlights at the Ontario bull sale held recently in Toronto.  
J. W. Daunt, Inglewood, showed the grand champion Shorthorn Bull, Glandore Lodestone, a superb white son of the imported bull, Aldie Royal Adonis. First animal to be sold, he brought \$1,000 from Buchanan and Bodkin, of Thamesville.  
Reserve grand champion was exhibited by S. G. Bennett, Georgetown, and sold at \$1,050 to Murray Farris, Bradford. This was for Scotsdale Lexicon, a son of the 1956 supreme champion at the Royal Winter Fair and Chicago International, Scotsdale Jupiter.  
Third high price for the sale went to R. W. Gardhouse, Milton, who received \$820 for Aberfeldy Viceroy, purchased by Jack Peck, Kippen. Fourth high Shorthorn price went to Bruce Fletcher, of Guelph, for Green Grove Baronet 11th, a performance tested bull with an official daily rate of gain of 2.45 pounds. The price was \$800, and the purchasers, Quinte District Cattle Breeders, Belleville.  
Another Fletcher bull brought \$535, and a second Gardhouse bull sold at \$625 to Norman Agar, Bolton.  
T. C. Amos, Moffat, won a class of 32 with his Amoslet Prince that sold for \$675. George Lasby, Guelph, sold one at \$540; T. Beardmore, Mono Mills, one at \$580; J. S. Norrish, Campbellville, one at \$510.  
Ninety two Shorthorn bulls in this sale averaged \$482.06, an increase of \$69.21 over last year's figure.
