**ADVISES POULTRYMEN
HEAR NUTRITION SPEAKER**

In an industry such as our poultry industry today, producers must keep abreast of the recent developments in management practices. Survival of producers within the poultry industry of today, and of the future, will depend to a large extent upon the ability of these producers to adapt themselves and their management practices to change. There have been great advances over the past decade in poultry breeding, in commercial feeds, and in general poultry know-how. Have you kept pace with the industry?

Dr. S. J. Slinger, the Poultry Department, OAC, Guelph, Ontario, is recognized internationally as an authority on poultry nutrition. When Dr. Slinger speaks at the Poultry Industry Conference and Exhibition to be held at the Western Fair Grounds, London, June 18, 19 and 20, he will have an interesting message for poultry farmers — "Feeding for Sustained Egg Production."
