**Collision Victim Won  
M. M. Medal Overseas**

Injuries received in a collision proved fatal for a Georgetown man, James Robert Corbett, 12 Prince Charles Drive, who died in Toronto Western Hospital on Thursday morning. The accident took place early Tuesday morning when Mr. Corbett's car collided with a gravel truck on the 6th line east, Chinguacousy, a quarter mile north of Grahamsville. He was on his way to work at Orenda Eng-

ines. Mr. Corbett who was thirty-eight years of age, was born in Toronto the son of Annabella McLaren Corbett and James Corbett. He lived in Toronto and attended Toronto schools and was later employed at the Maple Leaf Milling Company. During the second world war he served overseas with the Royal Regiment of Canada and was the recipient of the Military Medal for bravery. At the time of his death he was an employee of Orenda Engines.

In Toronto on November 23rd, 1940, he and Doris Warriner were married and she and their two children Susan and Robert survive him as do his parents and two sisters and a brother, Isabella (Mrs. Bill Skelly) Toronto, Margaret (Mrs. R. Willis) Toronto and Tom of Toronto.

**Family Were Pioneer  
Halton UEL Residents**

A U.E.L. descendant, Mrs. F. Taylor, the former Mrs. W. J. Poyer of Winnipeg, died recently at her home at Cumberland Mills, Quebec. She was the daughter of Augustus Stull who was born near Georgetown and taught school at Guelph and later at Bothay where his daughter was born. She later moved with her family to Portage La Prairie where her father became principal of the Portage Schools.

Of United Empire Loyalist descent, her father's family were among the first pioneers to arrive from Virginia at the time of the American revolution. She was the grand niece of the heroine of 1812, Laura Secord. In 1887 she married W. J. Poyer who was Notary Public of the Northwest Territories and they located at Duck Lake where she was only the second white woman in the district. She was able to relate many stories of their rugged pioneer experiences. In 1909 they moved to Winn-

ipeg where Mr. Poyer died in 1935. Surviving are her husband Frank Taylor, a son W. Poyer of Kelowna and a daughter Mrs. Eva Powell of Winnipeg. 10 grandchildren and 2 great grandchildren. Two sons predeceased her, Major W. S. Poyer who died in 1950 and Dr. Bruce Poyer who died in 1935. A cousin of Augustus Stull, Mrs. W. J. Roe, lives at R. R. 1, Georgetown. Funeral service was held in Cumberland Mills, Quebec.
