A former Georgetown resident will be ordained an Anglican minister tomorrow-morning in Walkerville.

Kenneth Jaggs, who attended public school here and was a choirboy at St. George's Church, will be ordained a priest when Bishop Luxton of Huron diocese officiates at a service in St. George's, Walkerville at 10.30 a.m. The new priest will conduct his first holy eucharist after the ordination.

DIRECT DISTANCE DIALING
EXPLAINED TO ROTARIANS

Members night for Georgetown Rotary was held last Monday evening, when Rotarians entertained a number of guests at North Halton Golf and Country Club at their weekly dinner.

After dinner the guests were introduced, and each member was called on to give a short biography of his particular guest.

A report was given by John Ord about the Crippled Children's Conference he had attended in Hamilton. He outlined ways that our work towards helping these children could be streamlined and improved.

Ralph Ursel, the chairman of the minstrel show that was so successful last month, announced that some of the highlights would be presented at the Hospital committee's big gala evening in the park on Saturday evening, May 24th at 8.00 p.m. The cast will begin rehearsals again this week for this and at popular request of many in the community who didn't see it.

He particularly demonstrated the new tiny transistors, that are supplanting tubes in radios, and also had with him a solar battery, which he demonstrated by using it, with the aid of the waning evening sun, to operate a battery.

Mr. Faulkner's talk on the new long distance telephoning system, was most instructive and thoroughly enjoyed, especially as he showed a number of diagrams and also charts showing the exact set-up in this country and the U.S.

He was introduced by Bill MacCormack and thanked by Les Clark. There will be no meeting, Monday, May 19th, due to the holiday.
