Bill Hillier's 857 triple placed him second. Greg Barr and Fran Zupatnik were honoured as the most improved bowlers.

Awards donated by the Lucky Strike Club for playoff competition only went to Mrs. Earl Emond for high triple, Mrs. Sid Hulme for high single, and Carl DeForest took both men's high single and high triple. Sets of glasses were also presented to the retiring executive and a Ronson lighter to Hene Kerr who is going to England.

Mrs. A. W. Norton returned home from Guelph General Hospital last Wednesday following an operation ten days before.

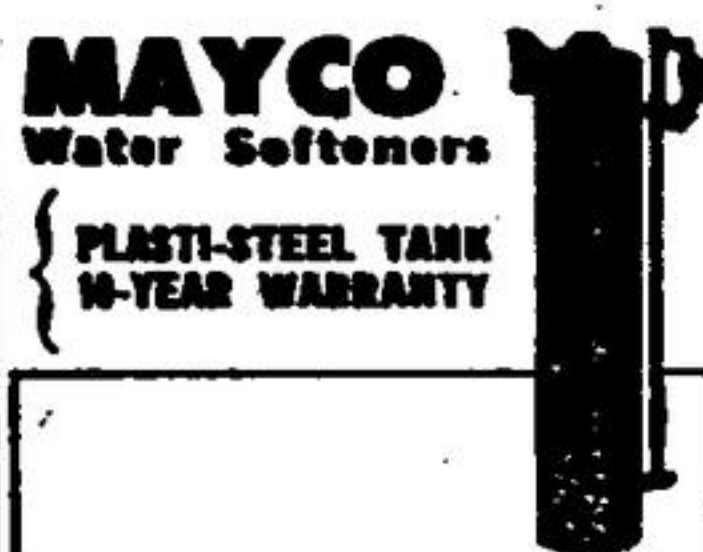
