

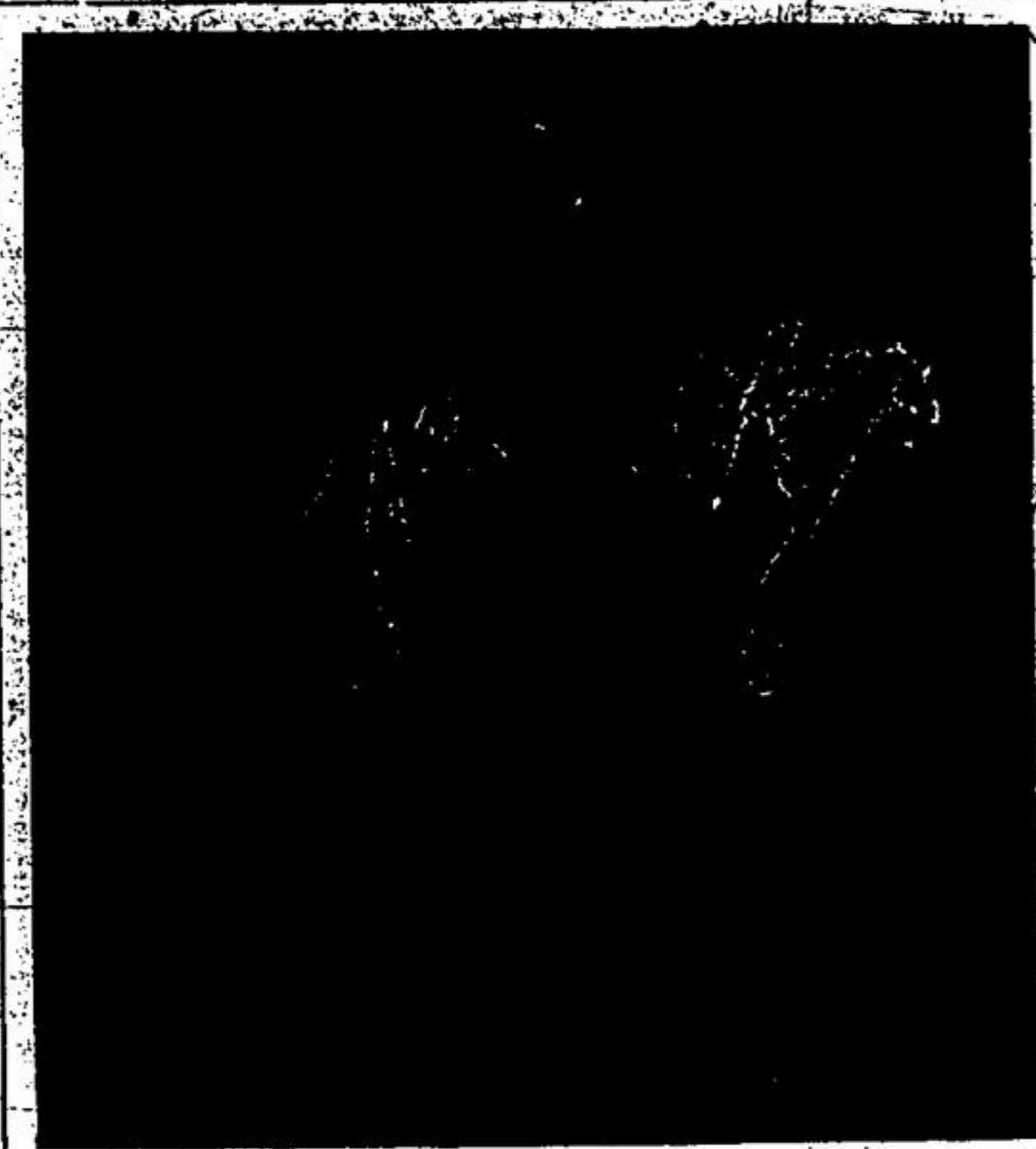

MANY FARM PEOPLE PLAN TO ATTEND MILL OPENING
 If you are thinking of visiting farm friends on Saturday, the last day of May, better phone first! Many farm families will be away that day, attending the opening of the new Purina Mill at Whitby. Leslie Frost.
