WANTS SEPARATE SCHOOL BUT DISAGREES WITH PROCEDURE

Dear Mr. Editor:

In reply to Mr. Joseph Gibbons' letter of the 12th inst. regarding a Separate School in Georgetown, may we say that while we sympathize with his anger, we disagree absolutely with his reasons and the objective of this anger. A small group of people did meet at a so-called public meeting, which the Board claims was called by five Catholic householders. I am one of those five householders, and did in effect, by signing my name to three public notices, call a meeting relating to the Separate School formation. But I did not choose, but instead was told by two of the seven men involved, the time and place of this meeting. Also, three of the six men who now serve as our Board of Trustees, posted these notices, and they are wholly responsible for their locations, rather than the five householders whose names appear thereon.

As a result, on Saturday night, April 26th, our present Separate School Board, was nominated and elected, in spite of the fact that at least half of those present, were opposed to it at that time and tried, in vain, to postpone it all, at least one night, so the meeting could honestly be called a public one, by announcing it to all the parishioners (Sunday) to the following morning (Sunday) to all the parishioners. This, we were told by the chairman and secretary of the election meeting would be illegal, according to the Separate School Act!!! The whole formation of this Board was so set up that no "outsider" present, including our most devoted pastor, who incidentally had no vote, could have changed it.

We are writing this, Mr. Editor, for the sole purpose of informing all Catholics, and anyone else interested, of the true events leading up to this situation which has become public. We are trying to point out that most objections raised, except possibly those of Mr. Gibbons, are not against a Separate School, nor are they against the Board, but only against questionable manner by which this Board came into being, and the obscure yet arrogant attitude they adopted at their first public

In a friendly spirit of cooperation, officers of the local company are allowing the Legionnaires a bit of practice on the range, which should help even things up a bit.

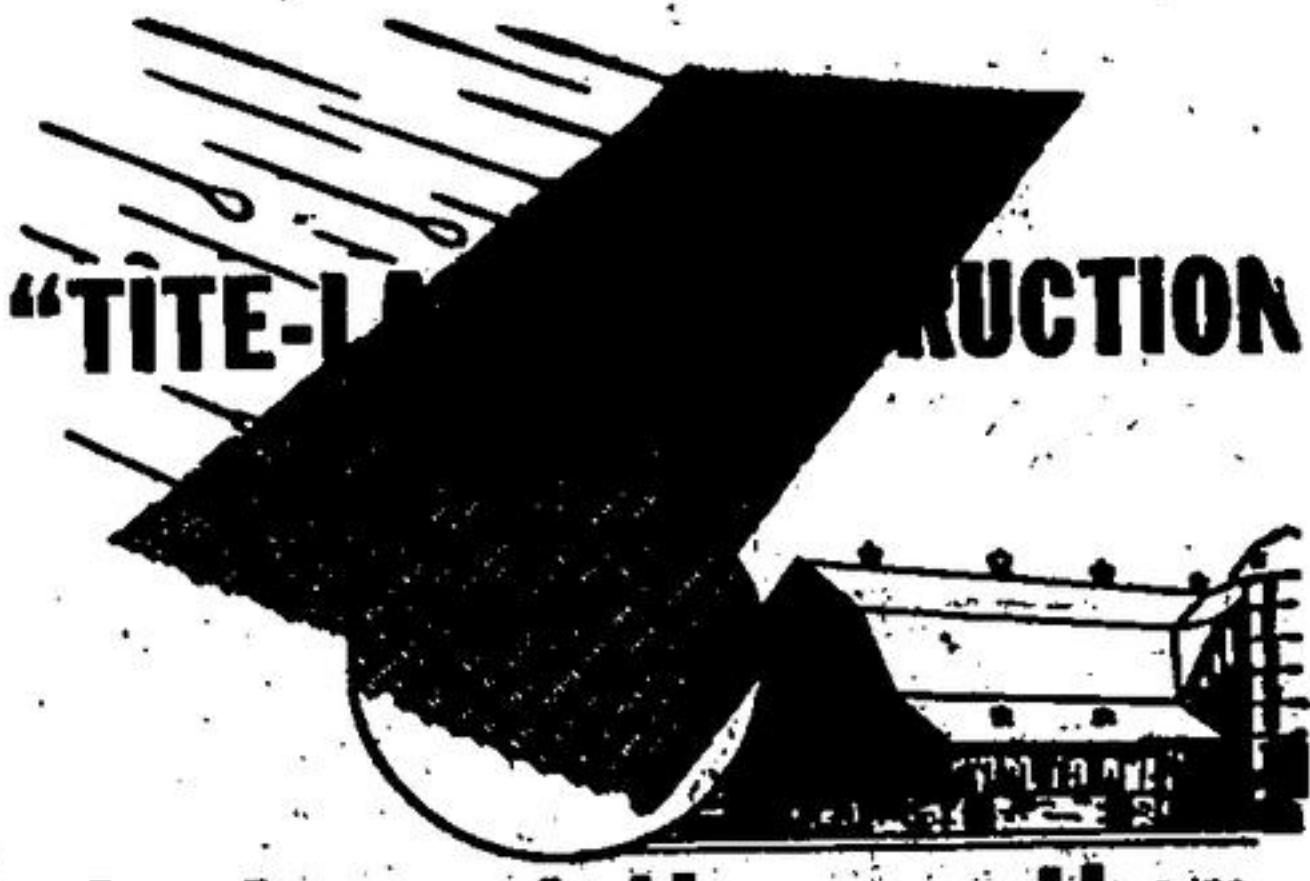

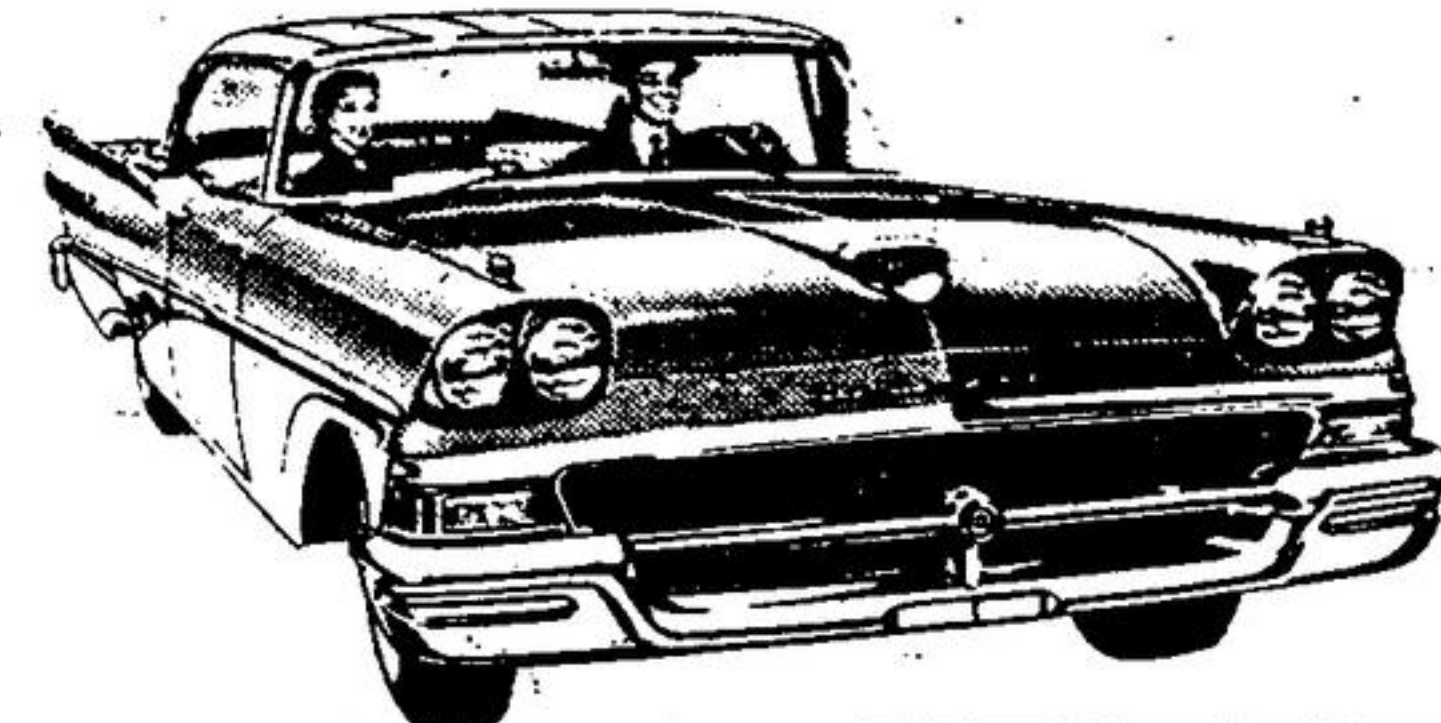

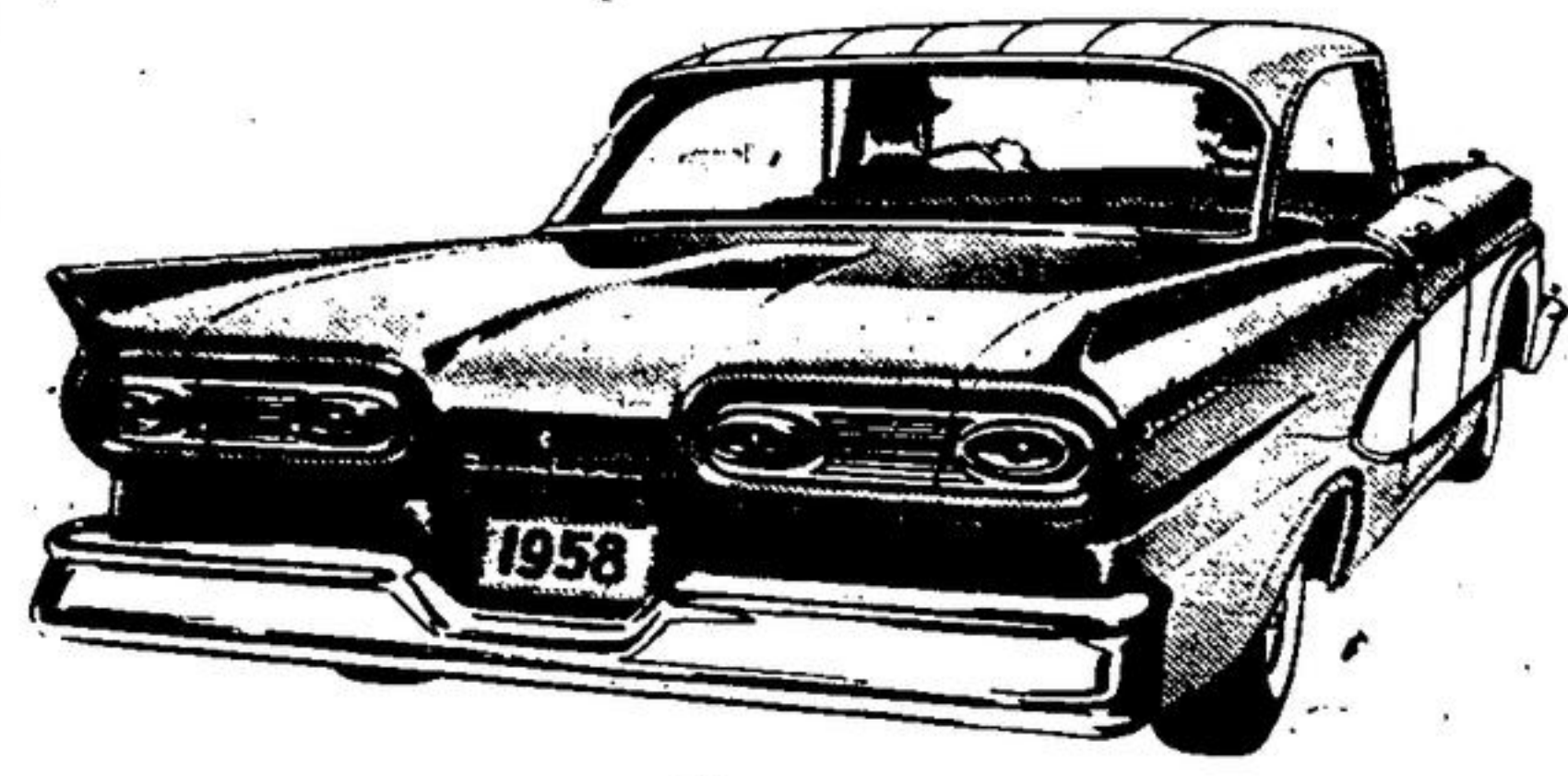
