### Craft Group Hears Prominent Musician

### Police Chief Attends Chatham Convention

Local police chief Roy Haley has returned from Chatham where he attended the eighth annual convention of the Ontario chiefs of police. Held in the William Pitt hotel, it was the largest gathering of police chiefs since the association was formed, with total assembly of ninety seven.

Listed among the speakers were American police officers, officers of the Detroit city department, a representative from the attorney general's department and the crown attorney for the city of Chatham as well as Safety Educators from Kitchener, Chatham and Toronto. Topics dealt with during the business sessions included police administration, enforcement of new restriction under the Highway traffic act, problems resulting from the increasing volumes of traffic and traffic safety.

Mrs. Haley accompanied the chief to the convention which lasted for four days.

### Landscaping Project Completed at School

Several months ago the groundwork for a landscaping project at Harrison public school was started and on Saturday, May 10th the work was successfully completed.

Principal Harold Henry acted as representative for the school while Edgar Beene, Mrs. Lytle DeVries and Ed Faris represented the horticultural society, in planning the beautification of the property surrounding Georgetown's newest public school. The society allotted \$50 towards cost of plants and arranged through Ernest Ball, purchasing agent for the society, to get a substantial discount on all material procured from a nursery. It was delivered on May 10th at noon, with Bob McColgan of Industrial Sand and Gravel making transportation available.

Pupils of Grade 8 took an active part in the work as well as a number of Grade 7 pupils and the planting was completed that day under supervision of Mr. Henry and Mr. Beene, assisted by Percy Lacey, Don Powers and Logan MacDonald.

Club Midtown's Constitution  
Foreword

Club Midtown is an organization formed by the teenagers of Georgetown, Ontario.

Purpose  
The club has been formed to provide clean healthful recreation for boys and girls of Georgetown and vicinity. It has been deemed necessary to provide further rules and regulations governing dress, conduct, etc. in order to maintain respectability and prevent any increase in juvenile delinquency.

Constitution  
1. Age limit - 13 years of age (discretion to be used by manage-

2. Admittance by membership card only.

3. No alcoholic beverages to be carried or consumed on premises.

4. Dress—No form of jeans or slim jims are to be allowed at any time. Excess clothing to be checked (lost or stolen articles not the responsibility of Club Midtown.) Only light shoes to be worn on floor. Character of dress worn is left to the discretion of the management.

5. Only authorized persons to be on the stage to handle records.

6. Chaperons will be present at all dances and parties.

7. Membership to Club Midtown is free.

8. All money received through operation of dances, fund raising, etc. will be handed over to the Club treasurer who will maintain an accurate set of books and will present a financial statement on request. Money held by the treasurer will be banked in Georgetown in an account under the club's name and the name of the vice-president or the president plus that of the secretary-treasurer is needed before any cheque can be issued.

9. An application stating age, address and telephone number, must be filled in before receiving membership card.

10. We reserve the right to refuse the admittance to any person.

11. Anyone causing a disturbance or damaging property will have his money refunded and will be asked to leave the premises.

12. Closing time for Club Midtown dances is 12:00 midnight unless special permission is granted.

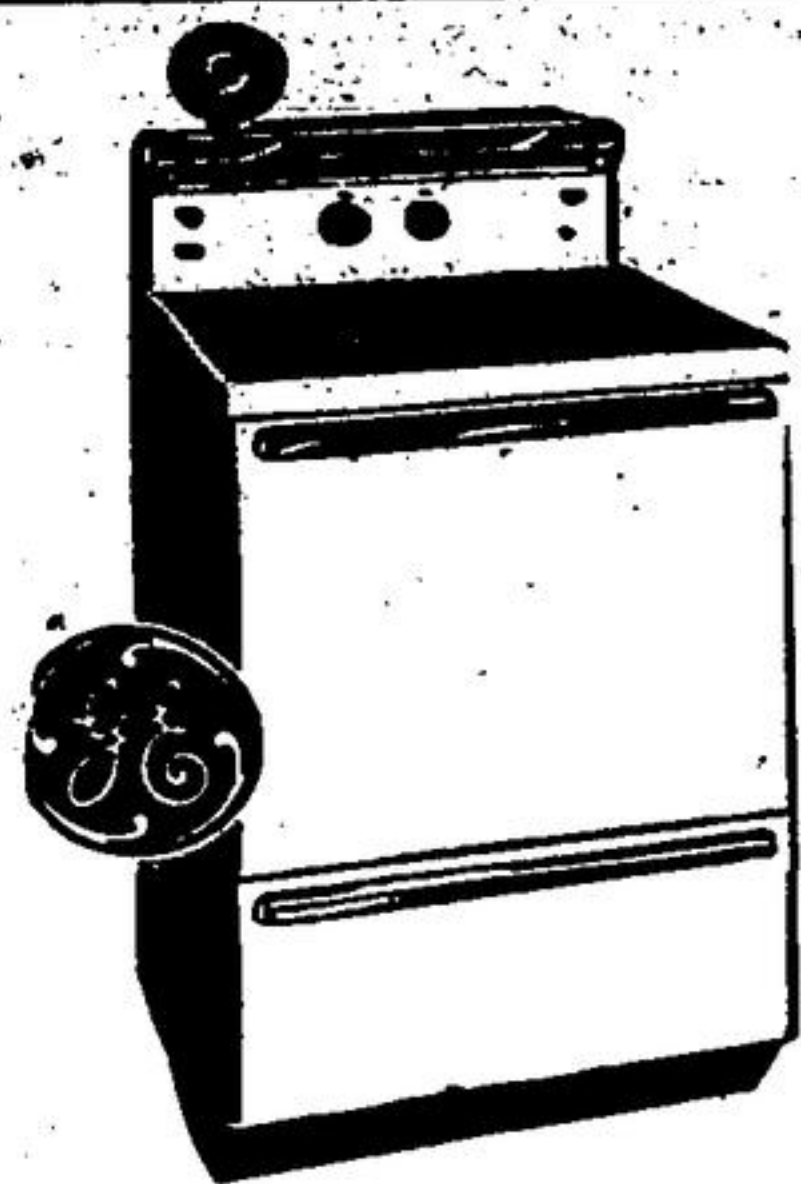

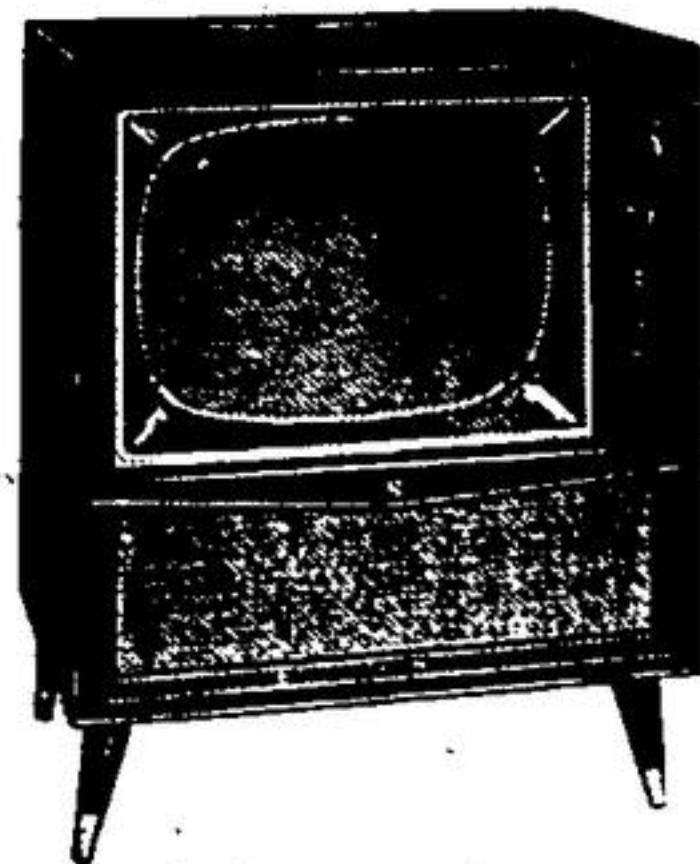
