Mayors, Ladies Council Seek Water Fluoridation

The Health League of Canada calls attention to an important fact that the controversy on fluoridation of water supplies enters a new phase of progress. Two important organizations, the Ontario association of Mayors and Roaves and the National Council of Women of Canada passed resolutions in favour of fluoridation of communal water supplies during their recent annual meetings.

The association of Mayors and Reeves asks Premier Frost to pass legislation that will permit all municipalities to fluoridate their water supplies. The resolution states, that in the 11 Ontario municipalities that fluoridate their water supplies under special bills, it has been proved that fluoridation will reduce dental decay by at least 65 per cent. "It is undemocratic to refuse municipalities the power to fluoridate their water supplies; if they wish" said Reeve Melvin Ontario Cancer Institute Swart of Thorold township. The re-Swart of Thorold township. The resolution was passed by an almost Has Modern Facilities unanimous vote.

The National Council of Women urges, that each local Council of Women promote the implementation of the fuloridation of the water supplies in every municipality in Canada. The Council's endorsement is based upon the fact that fluoridation of water has been endorsed by the heads of departments Dental Association, the Canadian Medical Association, the Canadian Public Health Association and the National Research Council, USA, the US Public Health Service, the American Dental Association, the World Health Organization, the Health League of Canada. Other facts on which the resolution was based are, that comparative surveys have been carried out which show, that there is considerably less tooth decay in children using fluoridated water, over a period of years, than in those not having it, and that there is an acute shortage of dentists in Canada.

The wide, smooth, silent corridors, the desks and comfortable chairs in every room, the meticulously chosen, gay drapes and lovely, spacious, pastel-tinted walls of the Ontario Cancer Institute reveal unmistakeably that the patient's physical welfare and frame of mind while under treatment at the hospital has been a major thought of everyone having to do with the planning and building of the Institute.

While not yet officially opened by the Ontario government, whose financial support, together with assistance from Ontario Division of the Canadian Cancer Society, has made this "mother" cancer clinic possible, work is already going ahead. Some 40 patients are already under treatment within the doors, and some 70-odd cups of tea are being served to outpatients by the yellow-smocked volunteers every morning of the week.
