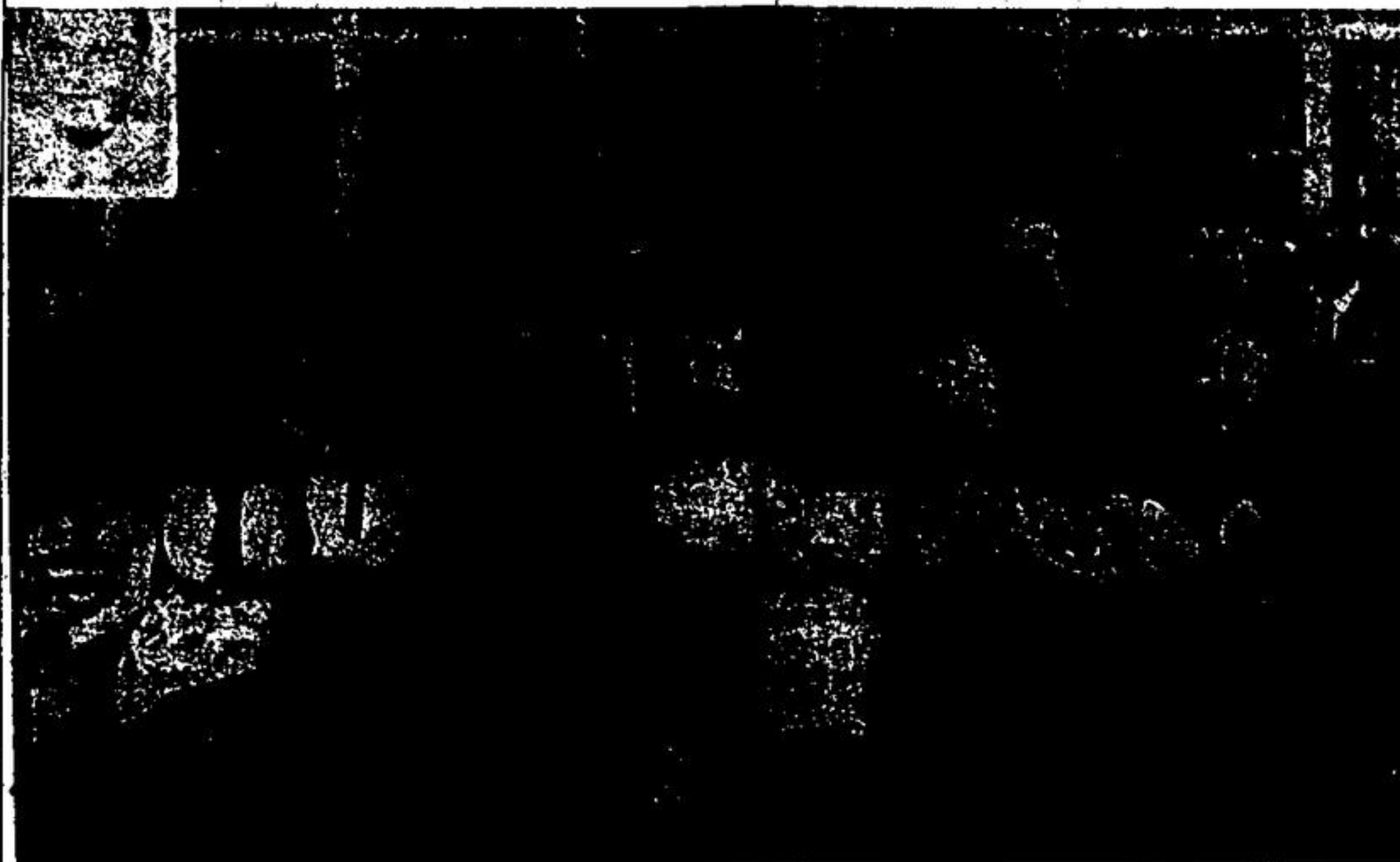

## Receives 21 Foot Letter From Belgian Congo Priest

### Stationmaster's Keys Have Trip to Iowa

Probably the longest letter ever processed through the local post office was a mammoth one received recently by Mr. and Mrs. Joe Van Wouw, Mountainview Road.

The letter came from his brother, Father Xavierus (Gerard) Van Wouw, who is stationed as a missionary on the Lukulezi Estate at Palombe, Nyasaland. The letter was written on many pages of paper, pasted together to make a scroll 21 feet long. Father Gerard is bilingual, but wrote this letter in Dutch, as it was to be forwarded to other relatives whose knowledge of English is not so extensive as that of his brothers Joe and Peter, both Georgetown residents. Postage on the letter was \$4c.

Six years in the Belgian Congo, Father Gerard is a member of the Montfort Order of Roman Catholic priests. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Arnold Van Wouw, of Lith, Noord Brabant, Holland, has a brother and three sisters, one a nun, in Holland. He had hoped for a furlough this fall, but two brothers of the Order died recently and he may have his plans delayed for a year until replacements come.

## Federation of Agriculture Again Offers 2 Scholarships

The Halton County Federation of Agriculture is again offering two scholarships, each of One Hundred Dollars, to enable worthy

students of the County to enter the First Year in one of the regular courses at the Ontario Agricultural College, Macdonald Institute, or the Ontario Veterinary College. In the event the first named institution is selected, the award will apply on either the Associate or Degree Courses at that institution. Candidates to be considered, must be at least 17 years of age by September 1st next, and must have successfully completed at least Grade X in Secondary School.

In the event more than two applications are received, selection will be based on 4-H Club activity; Junior Farmer activities; other achievements and Community activities; Academic standing; etc.

The announcement relative to the awarding of these two Scholarships will not be made until late August, by which time those planning to enroll in one of the degree courses at these institutions will know if they were successful in securing their departmental examinations from Grade XIII. In the meantime, those interested should contact the Agricultural Office in Milton and secure an application form.

## Two Brampton Girls Presented at Court

Though naturally disappointed in not meeting Queen Elizabeth, whose illness confined her to bed at the time, two Brampton girls had the thrill of being presented to the Queen Mother and Prince Philip at a garden party at Buckingham Palace.

They are Jane, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. R. M. Charters, whose father is member of the Brampton printing firm bearing the family name, and Carol Anne, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John S. Beatty.

Jane is one of 20 young people who will tour Britain as a member of Quest, a youth movement designed to provide opportunities for selected young people with leadership qualities to see the United Kingdom and to meet its people. Members of the group wear grey skirts or trousers, white shirts and bright red blazers with a Canadian crest.

The Canadian group met members from other parts of the Commonwealth when they docked at Liverpool. During the tour the Questers are billeted in private homes and universities. There will be three conferences during their 7-week stay.

Carol Anne is a member of the Bishop Strachan Chapel choir which competed in the Llangollen Musical Eisteddfod in Wales, then toured Scotland and England.

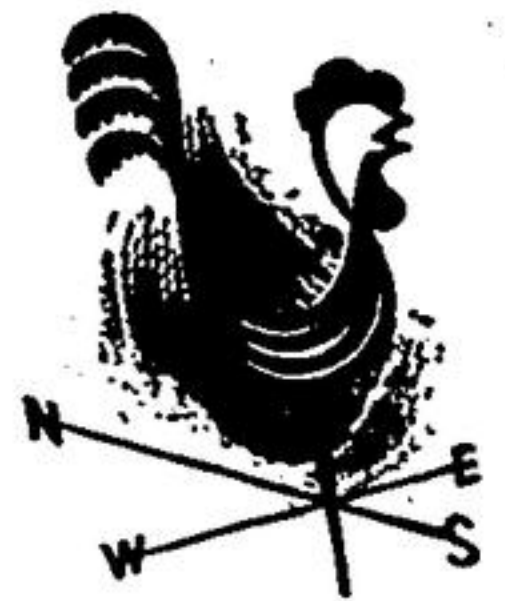
