**ESSAY COMPETITION**

Several counties in Ontario have conducted essay contests within the public schools, a practice that is recommended by the Crops & Soil branch of the Ontario Dept. of Agriculture. The Weed Inspectors Manual published by that department suggests the County weed inspector should visit every public school in his jurisdiction and speak to the children on some phase of Weed Control.  
 Due to there being some 87 public schools in Halton, the majority of which are fairly large graded schools, this practice was not adopted.  
 Through the co-operation of the public school inspectors, however, an essay competition was arranged early in the season. The pupils of grades 6, 7, and 8 have been invited to submit essays on the subject "My Part in Weed Control in Halton County."  
 A booklet entitled "Weed Control Guide" has been published by Halton county council and distributed to all the public schools by the inspectors office. Council has provided a first prize of \$3.00 and a second prize of \$2.00 for the best two essays in each municipality. In addition a grand prize of \$25 supplied through the courtesy of the Niagara Brand Spray Co., Burlington, Ont. is to be awarded to the child having the best essay in the county. It is also the intention of Warden W. E. Card to present a pen and pencil set to the teacher of the pupil winning the grand prize. Owing to the large size of the present town of Burlington, it is being divided, for the purpose of this competition, into two parts with those schools situated east of Brant Street together with the new Mountain Gardens School in Goup B. All entries must be in by October 15th, 1958.

 The duties of Zone Forester include supervising lands owned by the counties and under agreement with the department as well as lands owned by the counties but not under a direct agreement. He also is available to give advice on the management of woodland plantation and other forestry problems as a public service.  
 Mr. Finngland is a native of Cochrane where he attended public and high schools. He graduated from U of T in 1952 and since that time has been employed with a lumbering company in northern Ontario. He is a Registered Professional Forester.
