Sargent Road Ladies Plan Nursery School

Organized by three Sargent Rd. residents, the Boulevard Nursery School is planned to open on November 10th, as a boon to mothers, working or otherwise. The ladies aim to ease some of the problems parents face when both go out to work, the biggest one being the welfare of their children.

The staff will consist of Mrs. C. Crocker, supervisor; Mrs. C. Garbett, Reg. N. and Mrs. R. Rusywick, school teacher. School hours will be approximately 7 a.m. till 6 p.m. They plan also to cater to younger school children in need of lunches, and mothers who find it necessary to leave their children for one day or more.

Some of the services the ladies plan include morning inspection for symptoms of infectious diseases, sick children isolated till parents are notified; adequate toilet facilities, play and eating areas; regular rest periods; organized play; breakfast and lunch, morning and afternoon snacks.
