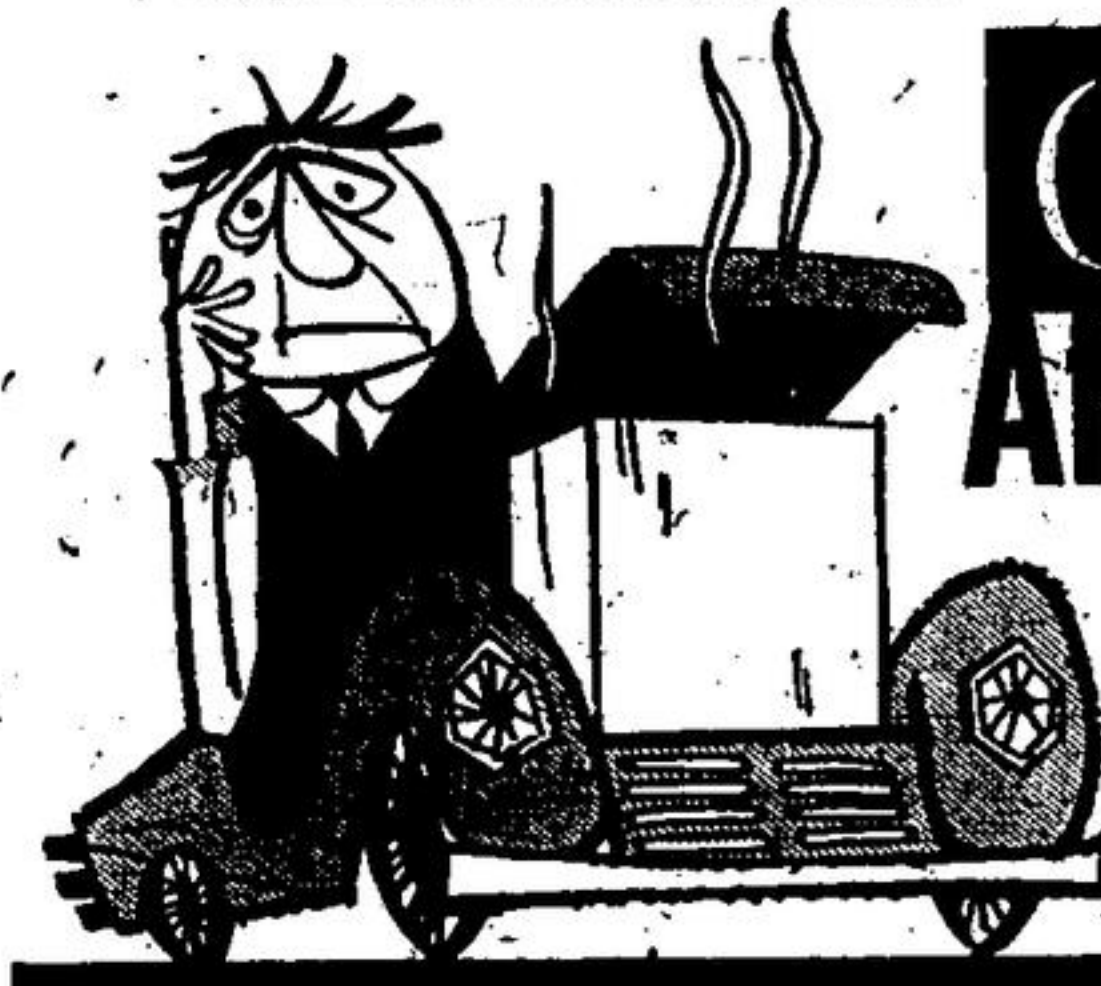
Rev. Lloyd Whan Begins Baptist Ministry Here

WEED CONTROL NEWS

QUEEN ANNE'S LACE
Wild Carrot, commonly called "Queen Anne's Lace" is one of the most persistent and troublesome weeds and is spreading very fast in Halton. Because of the dry weather early this season it would appear to be a little less prevalent than last year, but by the time this article is printed I feel sure its fine lacy leaves and large white heads will be quite evident in many parts of the county.
Many weeds are a hazard to the fruit and vegetable growers not only by robbing crop plants of nutrients and moisture but by playing host to various injurious insects. "Wild Carrot" is no exception as it is known to harbour ticks, carrots, parsnips, celery and parsley.
Where control consists of mowing, repeated cuttings are necessary in well established fields. This practice, however, will prevent plants from reseeding. Cultivation and short crop rotation will eradicate "Wild Carrot" if no seed

is permitted to develop in the seed crop. While applications of 2, 4-D have given adequate control of Wild Carrot in many parts of Ontario, recent experiments conducted by Mr. J. E. Whitlock indicate a stronger solution is necessary in Halton County. Adequate control of "Wild Carrot" may be brought about here by spraying with 24-32 ounces of equal parts 2, 4-D and 2, 4, 5-T active acid mixture per acre, providing plants are well soaked with the material. Such a strong solution of Brushkill, however, must not be used in or near susceptible crops.

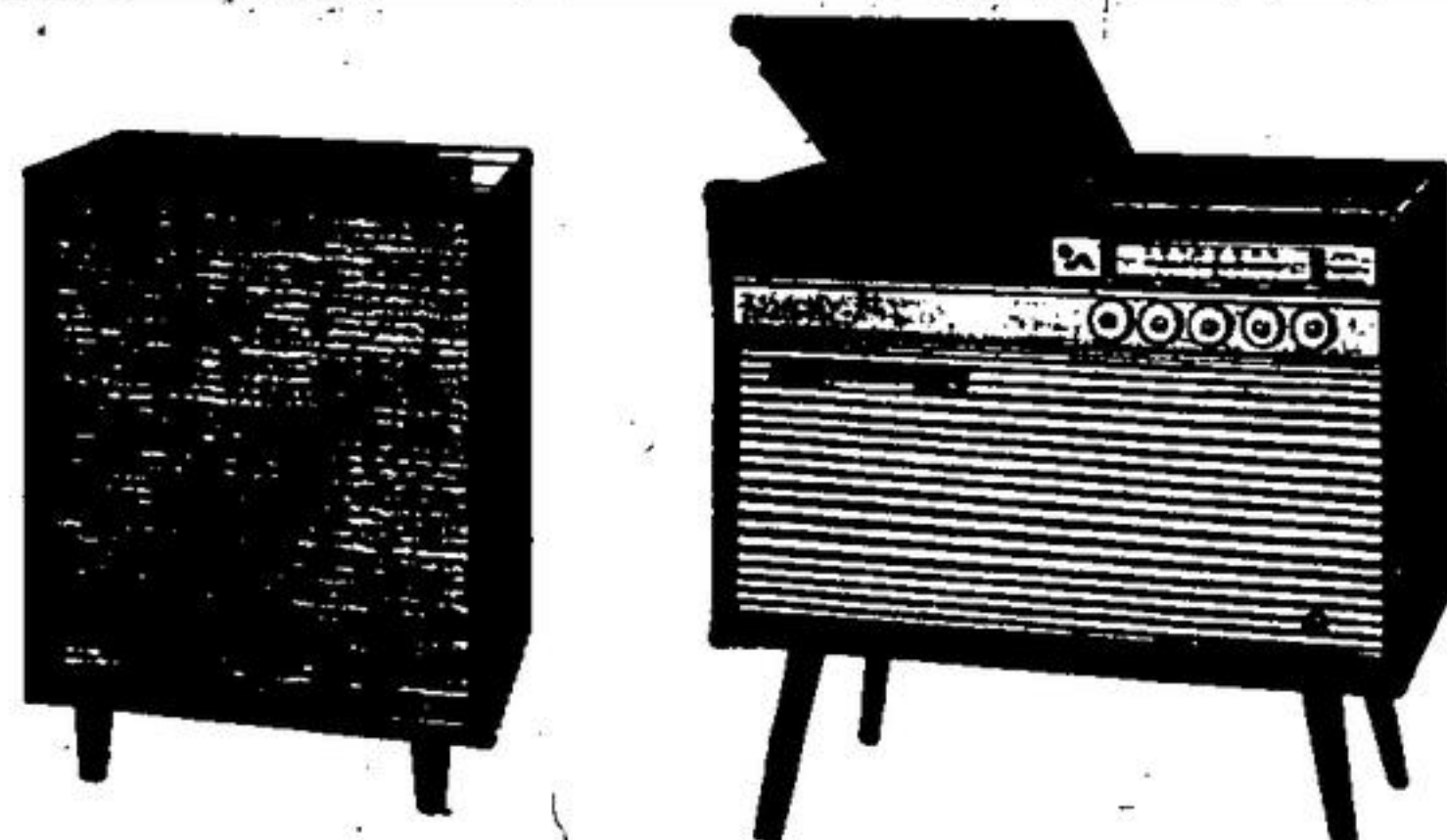

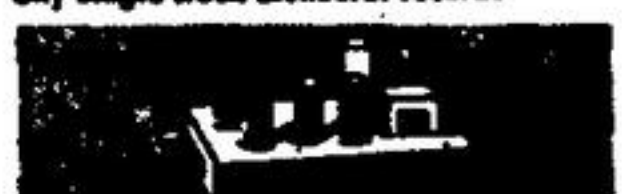

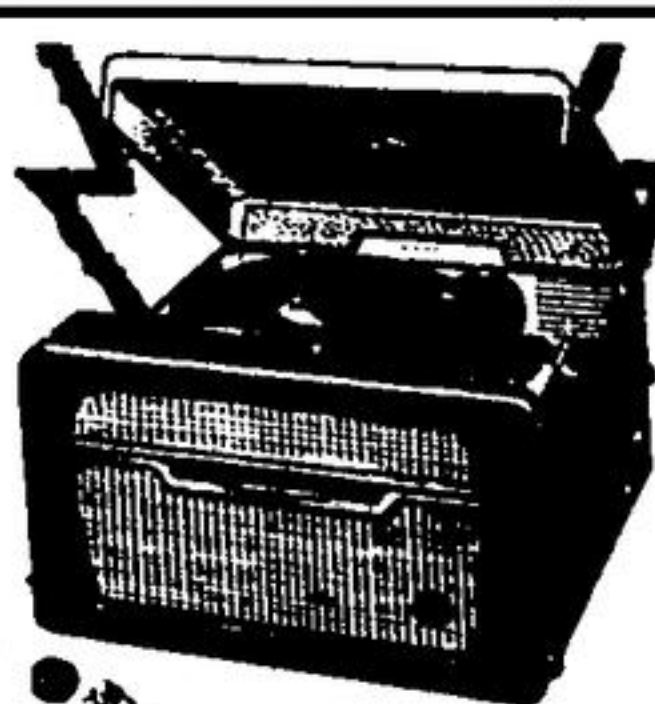
