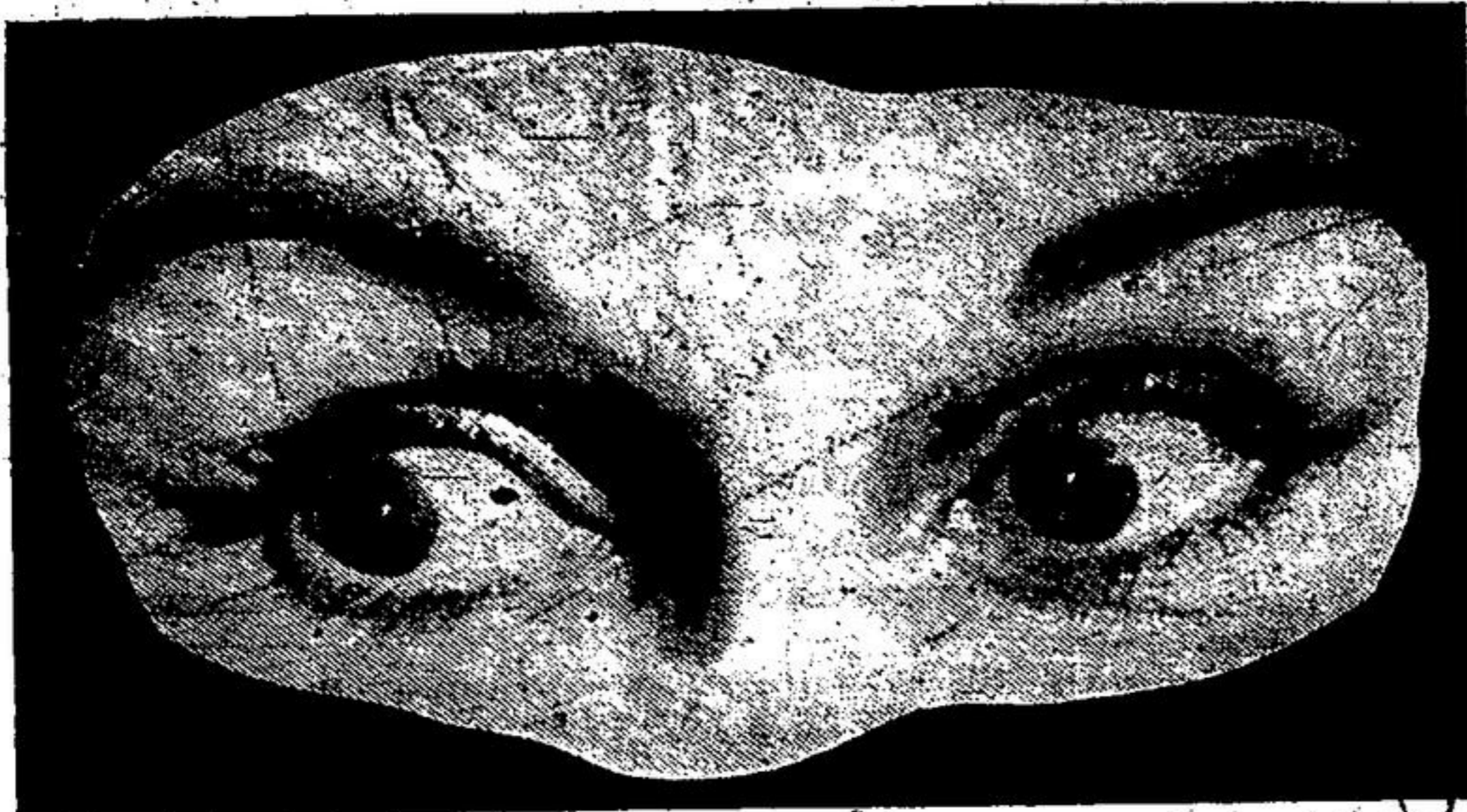

## Nine Teachers, 281 Pupils Georgetown's Newest School

Georgetown's "baby" in the public school department this year is the new Park School, and as befits the youngest in the family, it has the smallest enrolment (281) and is served by the smallest teaching staff (9 including Principal Harold Catling.) Presently housed on a shift system in Chapel St. School, the pupils are looking forward to moving into their own building in early November. Bumper class in the school is the 41-pupil Grade 2, while Grade 5 with only 22 pupils has the smallest enrolment. There are 1529 pupils in the four public schools in town, with a teaching staff of 48. A far cry from a few years ago, when Chapel St. school took care-of the needs of the whole town.
