**CATTLE PRIZE LIST  
1958 MILTON FAIR**

The 1958 annual fall fair of the Halton Agricultural Society will no doubt go down in history despite the rain and hail, as the best show in the past 100 years. In our opinion the exhibit in the two main halls was the best that we have seen in the past 25 years. Certainly, the directors, both ladies and men, may well take a bow for a job well done. As indicated in our column of a week ago, the Junior Farmer section was the largest since its inauguration, eight years ago. The Junior Farmers officers, the 4-H Club members and their leaders are to be congratulated on the thought and work they put into the 36 inter club educational displays. Unfortunately, our duties prevented us seeing all branches of the show, but we did see quite a bit of the cattle show, both beef and dairy, and the quality and numbers were outstanding. While we have seen larger numbers of dairy cattle at Milton, the slight decrease here was more than compensated by the increase in the beef breeds.

Twenty-eight Halton exhibitors brought out 141 entries for the inspection of J. M. Fraser, noted "Black and White" breeder and judge, of Huttonville. When the 16 first and second prize winners paraded for the senior female championship, Holstein fieldman George Drennan was overheard to comment: "That group of animals would be a credit to any Class A show in the country!"

**Repeat Triumphs**  
Wilfrid Leslie and Sons CNE grand champion sire, Spring Farm Fond Piebe, and Howard Gowland's Sheffield Supreme Chico, both repeated their triumphs at CNE, by taking the grand and reserve grand championship awards for males.

A new exhibitor for Halton, namely George and L. H. Leaver of Campbellville, had the junior champion male on Rosaf Pearl Tarquin, with the reserve going to Stafford Bennett and Gordon Sinclair's Clairdale Higheroft Designer.

In the female section, Ward Brownridge took the junior female championship on Grand Valley Maple Actorette and Percy Leslie the reserve on his winning junior yearling Lessiny Lass De Kol Homecraft.

In the senior female division, Twin Rivers Sovereign Kate repeated her 1957 achievements for Barbara Y. Royle by taking the senior and grand championship awards, while Sherholme Elm Villa Abbecker took the reserve senior and reserve grand-awards for A. Morley Sherwood. These two great cows also took the top two places on the "best udder class."
