## Home Canvass Will Ask Funds for Blind Institute

The Canadian National Institute for the Blind will launch its annual appeal for funds in the Georgetown area on Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday of next week.

The door to door canvass is being conducted by the Women's Auxiliary of Branch 120, Canadian Legion and members of the IOOE.

There are 49 registered blind persons living in Halton and the CNIB offers the following services, free of charge: library service, craft teaching, job placement service, special instruction for the pre school child and the familiar white cane.

Money is needed to supply the many services offered free to the 49 registered blind in Halton, 7 of whom are living in Georgetown. These services help these people to achieve a large measure of independence and self sufficiency that they otherwise could not easily attain.

For instance, a few years ago, when the blind housewife put a pie in her oven, washed the dishes, or sewed, her effort was regarded as little short of superhuman. Today, through the teaching service of the Canadian Institute for the Blind, it is merely a routine chore, as are the many other activities now actively pursued by blind persons.

The need is urgent. So when the canvasser calls at your home, will you be sure and give generously? Remember, that blindness is a handicap and that your dollars will help the blind of Georgetown and district to overcome their handicap.

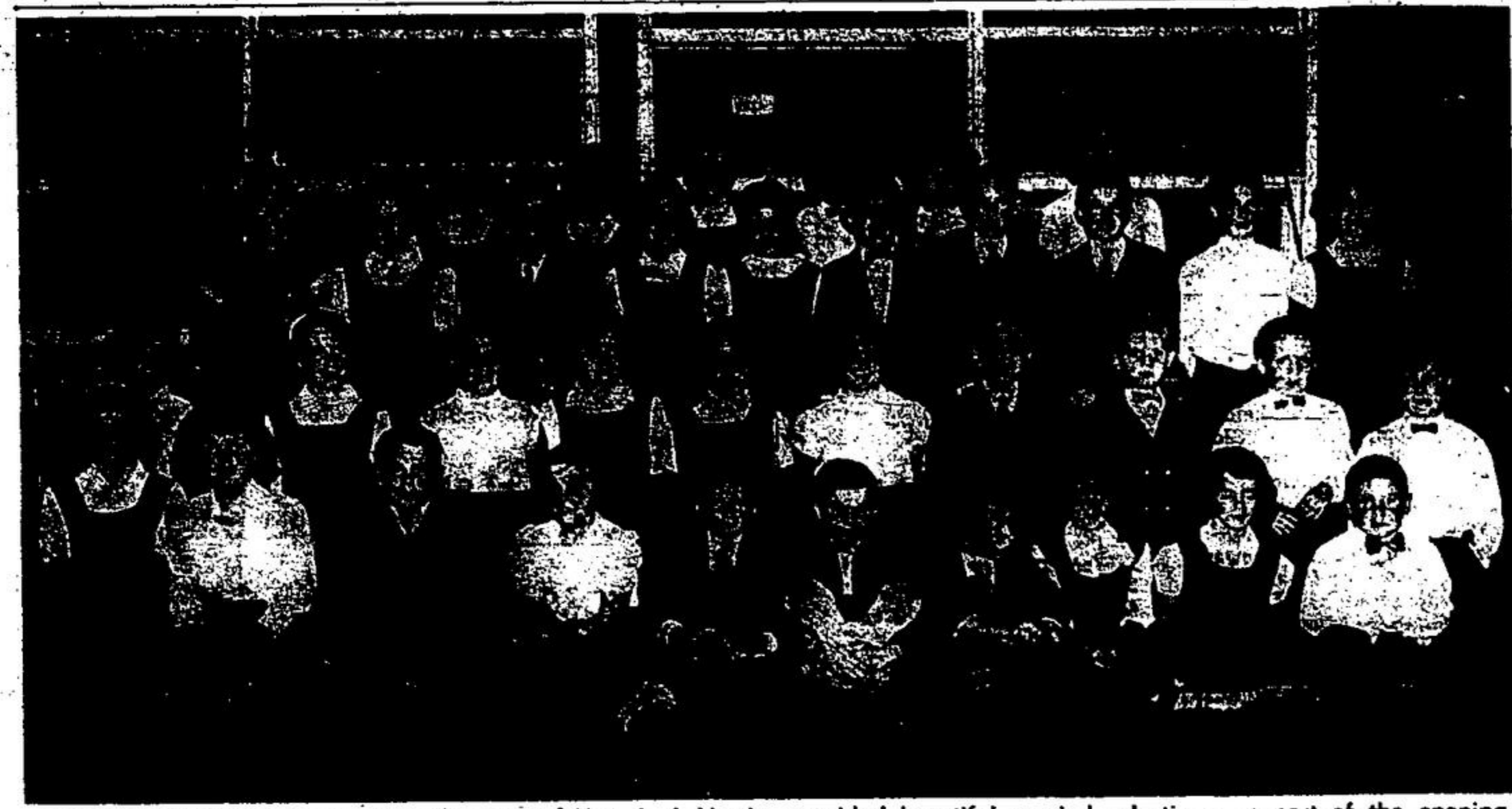

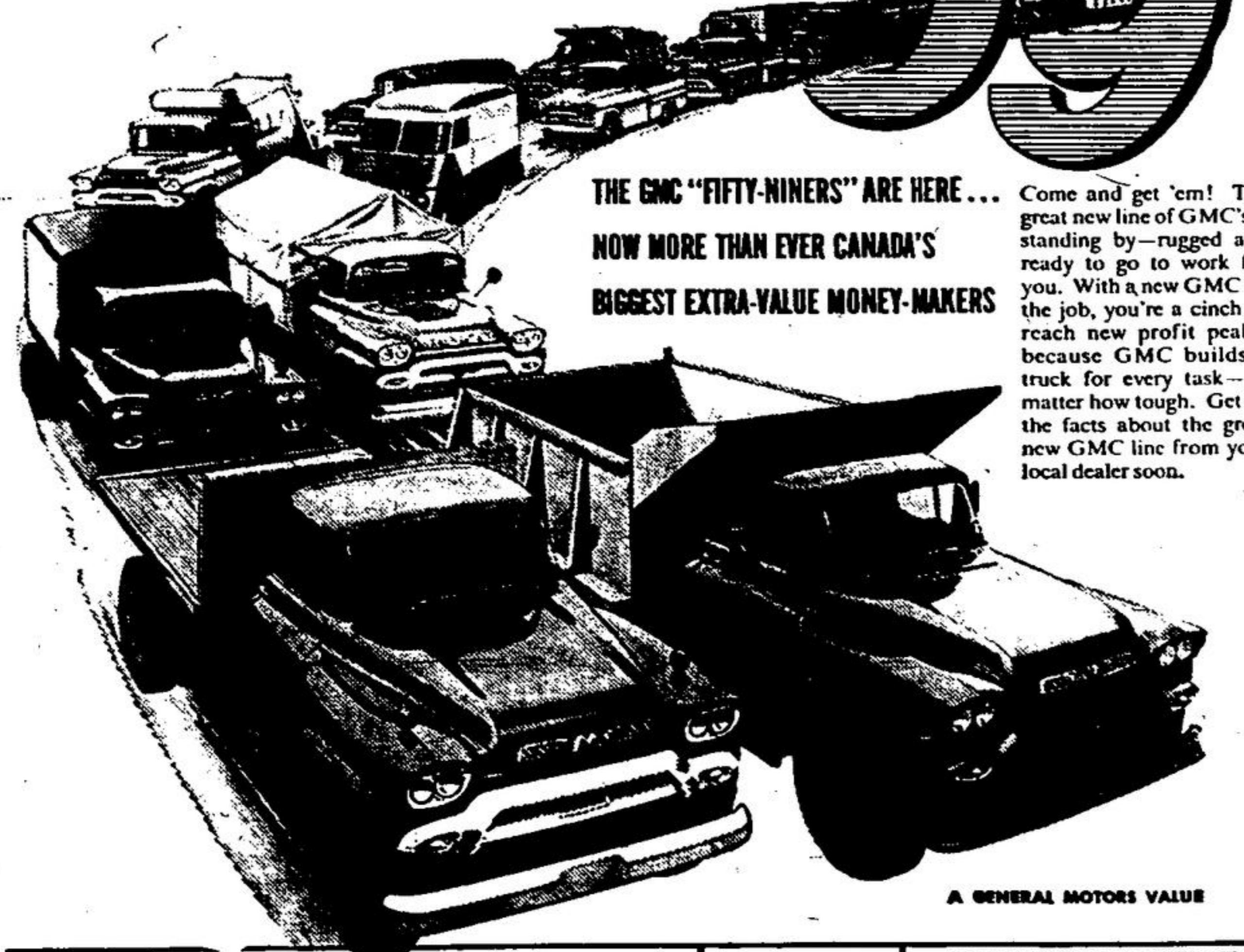
