Elsie Gregory MacGill Speaks at Coffee Party

The Business & Professional Women's Club celebrated Business Women's Week with a coffee party at the North Halton Golf & Country Club. They entertained thirty business and professional women of Georgetown who were not members of the club, a great many of whom are new residents of town.

Miss Elsie Gregory MacGill, immediate past president of the Provincial Federation was an honoured guest. Miss MacGill was the first woman to graduate as an electrical engineer from the University of Toronto in 1927. She is in her thirtieth year as a professional engineer and her fifteenth as a consultant engineer, specializing in aeronautics. After a brilliant career in the U.S. she came back to Canada and during World War 2 she was in charge of all engineering work in connection with the production of the Hawker Hurricane fighter aircraft for the United Kingdom and Curtis Wright Helldiver fighter for the U.S. navy. She received the Gzowski medal from the Engineering Institute of Canada in 1941. She also received the annual award from the American Society of Women Engineers in 1953. In the same year her photograph was included in the Gevaert gallery in Ottawa — a tribute to the 50 Canadians who are responsible for this country's great industrial development during the past 15 years. Miss MacGill is also the author of the best seller "My Mother the Judge" a biography of her mother published by the Ryerson Press in 1955. Miss MacGill spoke on Business & Professional Women in Action. Speaking on the several achievements accomplished by the Federation during the past two years.
