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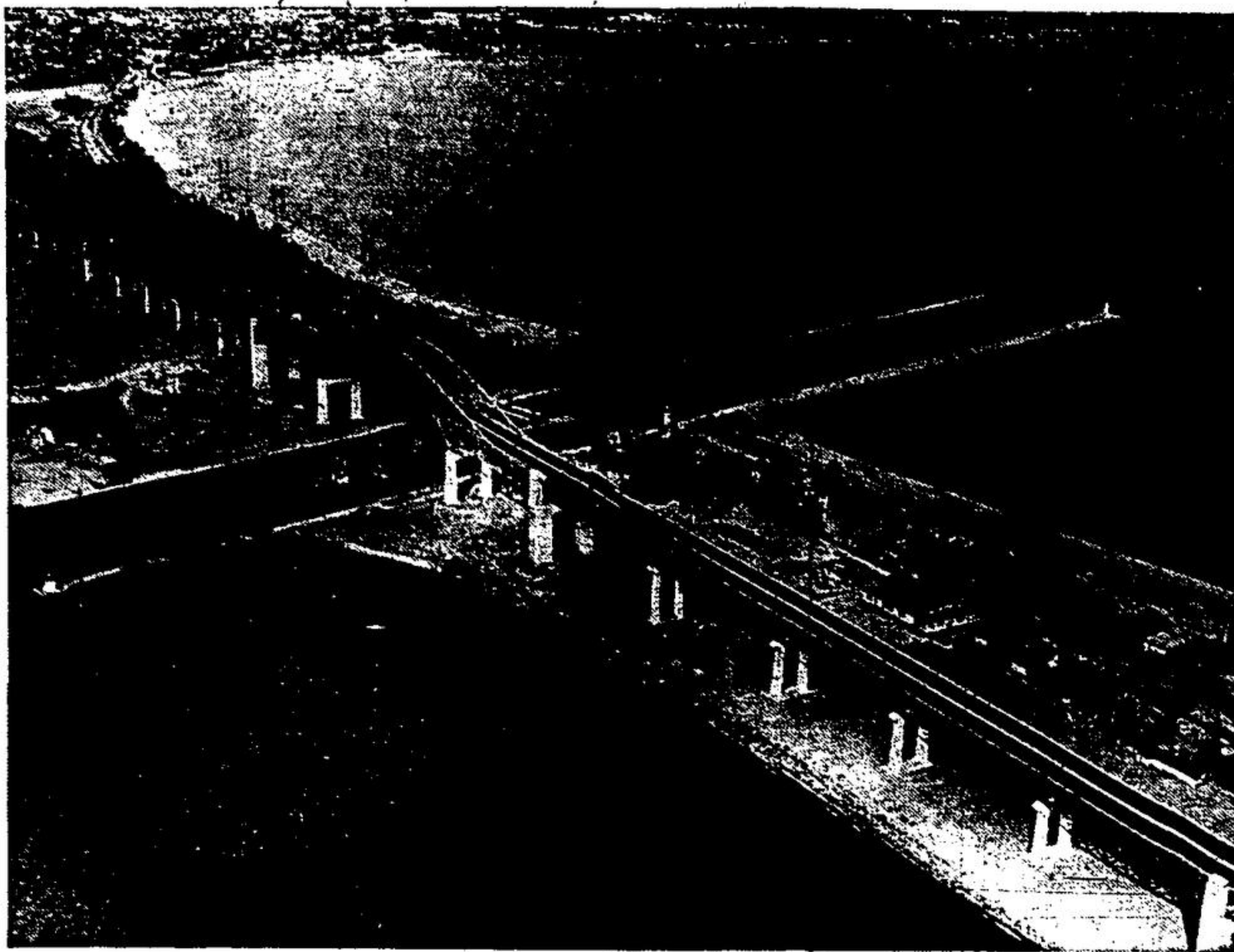
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**HUSBAND TRANSFERRED

## Open Burlington Bay Skyway Tomorrow



WHEN THE BURLINGTON BEACH SKYWAY is officially opened by Prime Minister Leslie M. Frost next Thursday, October 30th, it will provide (with the approaches) four and a half miles of four-lane controlled access highway to replace the last remaining section of two-lane highway on the Queen Elizabeth Way between Toronto and Niagara Falls. The \$19,000,000 Skyway will eliminate the bottleneck on the Q.E.W. caused by the 30-mile speed limit through the built-up areas of Burlington Beach and Hamilton Beach and the stoppage of traffic when the Burlington ship canal is in operation, as shown in this aerial photo of the Skyway.

## Polling Booths and Election Officers Chosen for December Town Vote

Municipal election machinery is in motion as the November 27th Georgetown nomination meeting approaches.

As is customary, council has appointed C. G. Benham, the town's clerk-treasurer as returning officer for an election which, if required, will be held on Monday, December 8th. Voters lists, containing names on the town assessment roll as at September 30th are in process of printing.

To take care of increasing population in the eastern part of town, a new polling subdivision has been created this year. Otherwise, division of subdivisions will remain the same as in 1957. Post cards will be mailed to all voters advising them of their polling place in advance of election day.

No special questions are on the ballot this year. Nominations will be received on November 27th during the hour period between 7.30 and 8.30 p.m. in Wrigglesworth auditorium for the offices of mayor, reeve, deputy reeve and six councillors; one hydro commissioner and three public school trustees. Councillors serve a one year term; hydro and school trustees two year terms. A public meeting will follow nominations, when elected and appointed officials review the year's program, candidates are invited to speak, and the public may express opinions from the floor.

All voting in Georgetown is by general vote. Originally the town had three wards, each electing their own two councillors. While the system has been abandoned, the ward boundaries are still retained and used for polling purposes. Ward I covers mainly the "White Bridge" district; Ward II, the College View and Queen St. area; and Ward III the park district and Delrex part of town.

## View Museum Collection Of Rare, Extinct Birds

Dr. and Mrs. L. Everett Jaquith of Terra Cotta have just returned from New York City where they attended the 75th anniversary meeting of the American Ornithologists' Union. Mrs. Jaquith is a member of the A.O.U.

While at the convention, Dr. and Mrs. Jaquith with Mr. J. L. Baillie of the Royal Ontario Museum had the privilege of examining the study collection of rare and extinct birds at the American Museum of Natural History. Seven species of North American birds are in that collection. All seven were formerly abundant and are now extinct because they were killed in great numbers. We can no longer enjoy seeing Passenger Pigeons, Eskimo Curlews, Heath Hens, Carolina Parakeets, Labrador Ducks, Ivory-billed Woodpeckers or Great Auk.

On Sunday, Oct. 19th, the members of the American Ornithologists Union were entertained at dinner by the New York Zoologists Club and were shown rare birds in captivity at the Bronx Zoo.
