

The speaker indicated the need for such a Society by showing that from Adam's creation God has al ways had a channel of communication on the earth through which his divine law has been made known to mankind. Emphasizing the need for a channel in this day the speaker pointed out that the issue of universal sovereignty (who will rule the universe, Satan the Devil or Jehovah God the Creator) is to be settled in this generation. "Mention by Jesus in Matthew of a 'faithful and discreet slave' has ful fi'lment today in the existence of the governing body of Jehovah's Witnesses, which body used the Watch Tower Society as its legal in-

strument," Mr. White said. The development of the Watch Tower Society from the 1870's with first headquarters in Allegheny, Pennsylvania, to the present headquarters in Brooklyn, N.Y., and branch offices in 84 lands, a missionary training school in New York State, heading preaching and missionary work in 170 lands and islands outlined by the speaker." The tremendous increase of this group, all members of which are ministers, "is evidence," Mr. White said, "of God's blessing and approval on our work and worship."






