70 MEN OF ST. JOHN'S PLAN VISITATION TOUR

This Sunday, St. John's United Church will have its Every Member Visitation, when an expected 70 men will go out and visit homes in the older sections of town associated with the church. The Delrex area will be visited the following week, November 16th.

This is the third year that St. John's has participated with churches of different denominations in this area in the sector plan. Eight hundred churches across Canada are joining in the canvass this year.

At a dessert buffet in St. John's Memorial Hall on October 19th, the congregation discussed plans for 1959. Christian education facilities urgently require additional facilities. An architect has been engaged to plan this extension. One new boy scout troop has been formed this year, bringing the total to two, also a new girl guide group and a brownie pack were started. In addition there are Explorers for girls, 3 cub packs, a CGIT group and the Young People's Union. Attendance at Sunday School averages 350.

St. John's is the first local church to actively plan a new church in the Delrex area, and in years to come Georgetown will have two United Churches when plans are carried out for the new structure.
