The Liberal proposal that teacher salaries should be paid by the provincial government is a mis guided and dangerous form of relief from the financial burdens faced by municipalities because, of the failure of senior levels of government to share equitably in education costs, said Donald Mac-Donald, MPP, Ontario CCF leader, speaking to a meeting of the county CCF association on Octo-
