John Gunn was returned as president of the Georgetown and District Hospital Association Thursday, Nov. 25th, when the association held its election of directors at the annual meeting in the municipal building.

An attendance of some 25 including representatives from local service clubs saw the entire executive re-elected, including the secretary, Mrs. Lloyd Marks; treasurer, Mrs. William Hamilton; and directors, William Kinrade and Denney Charles.

In giving a resume of the association's 1958 activities, Mr. Gunn stated that land had been purchased and preliminary plans for the hospital itself had been passed by the medical committee and building committee. The year's financial statement by Mrs. Hamilton was distributed and passed.



Mrs. Harold Cleave Active in Many Ladies' Activities

The town was saddened last week when Mrs. Harold Cleave, wife of an ex-mayor, and county ex-warden, died suddenly at her home on Cleaveland Drive on Sunday, November 23rd. Mrs. Cleave was born in Carbon Hill, Alabama, the daughter of the late Mary Cole and John McDonald, and came to Georgetown in 1907. She attended Georgetown public and high schools and later a business college in Toronto. Her first position was with H. W. Kennedy, who was the village clerk and treasurer. She later took a position in the Bank of Hamilton, which was situated where Holmes St. to \$1.00 Store is now.

Mrs. Cleave was very active in local affairs. She was a diligent and faithful worker in her church, St. John's United being a member of the Women's Association and for many years a member of the choir, and also served on the board at Cedarvale School for Girls. She was a charter member of Verdun Rebekah Lodge, a past district deputy, past noble grand and had received the Degree of Chivalry. The Georgetown Lawn Bowling Club and the Women's Institute were organizations in which she was also very active.

Mrs. Cleave is survived by her husband, Harold and one sister, Mrs. Tom McMurchy of Thornhill. A sister and a brother, Mrs. Charles Ruddy and Harvey McDonald predeceased her.

Funeral service was conducted in St. John's United Church Wednesday, November 26th, with Rev. Morgan McFarlane officiating, assisted by Rev. John Smith of Whitchy.

Burial was in St. John's United Church cemetery, Napanee, Ontario.
