## Some Tips For Voters....

With many people voting in Georgetown for the first time on Monday, a few explanations might be in order this week for guidance.

before the voters, the town council and the public school board. The council is composed of nine members, the mayor, reeve and deputy reeve, all of whom have been elected by acclamation, and six councillors. Thirteen men and women are contesting the six council seats. Georgetown has no ward system, and every voter has the privilege of marking his X beside any of the names up to a total of six. It is possible, should a voter wish, to vote for less than six. It is not uncommon, should a person wish to give what is known as a "plumper" to support only one candidate. But it is important that no more than 6 be marked, or your ballot does not count. Remember also, that an X is the only mark recognized when ballots are checked, and any other mark vetoes your vote.

The public school board differs from council. Here members serve a two year term, with three coming up for election each year. Five men Two branches of municipal government are are candidates for the three posts, and the same rute applies - you can vote for any number up three, but no more.

The public school board has charge only of public school affairs. As part of a high school district, the local high school comes under jurisdiction of a central board, comprising appointees from five municipalities and the county council.

Polls are open on Monday from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Each voter will receive a card in the mail this week, telling him where to vote. 
