

Women's Institutes to Make Survey of Farm Accidents

J. E. W. Halton Women's Institutes will sponsor a survey of all farm accidents in Halton in 1950, states Mrs. Velma Norris, president of Halton District Women's Institutes. The project was approved at a recent meeting of the officers and directors of the Halton W.I.'s following a request from Agricultural Representative J. E. Whitelock. The Halton survey will be a part of similar surveys which will be made in each county and district of the province, commencing March 1st, 1950, and continuing for a period of twelve months. The reasons for conducting such a survey are two fold; first, to ascertain the incidence and types of farm accidents; and secondly, to provide a guide for a farm safety educational program. Such farm safety educational programmes carried on over a period of eight years following surveys in the U.S., have according to the National Safety Council, shown the following reduction in fatal farm accidents: Minnesota 20 per cent; Kansas 40 per cent; Wisconsin 30 per cent; Ohio 31 per cent. A report from Illinois indicates that the corn picker accident rate of 100 Illinois committees with safety programmes has been reduced to one-sixth of the rate before a safety programme was initiated. With this sort of evidence to encourage them, and keeping in mind that statistics reveal that one member of every fourth farm family will be an accident victim in 1950, the Halton ladies are entering wholeheartedly into laying plans for the survey of farm accidents in Halton in 1950.

To this end, the executive committee of the Halton District Women's Institutes met last week and set up the following county farm accident survey committee. County chairman, Mrs. Velma Norris; County secretary, J. Allen Francis; Esqueting Twp. chairman Mrs. Hector Bird; Burlington Twp. chairman Mrs. J. M. Roadhead; Nassagaweya Twp. Chairman, Mrs. Chester Service; Trafalgar Twp. chairman Mrs. Percy Merry.
