Speyside Accident Victim**

An 83 year old resident of R. R. 3, Milton, Janet McCallum Hampshire, died instantly Friday night when struck by two cars while crossing No. 25 Hwy. just south of Speyside. She was a sister of W. J. L. Hampshire, former county sheriff.

Miss Hampshire was walking across the highway from her farm home on the west side of the road to visit a neighbour when she was struck by a northbound car driven by Martin Charles McNeil of 107 Martin St., Milton. The impact threw her into the southbound lane where she was struck the second time by a car driven by John Irving of R. R. 3, Milton. The fatality occurred at about 7.05 p.m. and was investigated by Col. Ray and address of the county detachment OPP at Milton.

2nd Generation Farmer**

William Ross Stalker, died at his home lot 23, Concession 4, R. R. 4, Acton, on Wednesday, December 10th at the age of seventy-four. Mr. Stalker was born on the home farm where he died, as was his father before him. He was educated in district schools and settled to farming when he was finished his education. He was a member of Knox Presbyterian Church, Acton.

In 1928 he was badly injured when a tree fell on him and broke both his hips and he had found it difficult to carry on with farming since that time. He suffered a stroke in September and had been in ill health since then.

His parents, Ann Ross Stalker and John Stalker predeceased him. Surviving are sisters Ann, Acton, Jean (Mrs. Hazen Graham) Georgetown and Minnie (Mrs. Joseph Findlay) Toronto. Two nieces and two nephews are also left, Mrs. Eleanor Hodgins and Mrs. Ann Sproule, John Graham and Glen Findlay.

Rev. A. H. Mackenzie officiated at the funeral service at the Rumley-Shoemaker Funeral Home, Acton, on Friday, December 12th at 2 p.m. He was assisted by Rev.
