MARKERS WHITE ON BLACK ON SALE THIS FRIDAY, JAN. 2

The Department of Transport has announced that 1958 car markers will be on sale at all agents this Friday (Jan. 2nd). This year they are a black plate, with white lettering. The minister has also warned that again this year there will be no extension of the deadline, and that the public would be well advised to obtain their plates early. The Department also points out that liability insurance slips must be given to obtain their plates, or an extra \$5.00 will be charged. It is also pointed out that this \$5.00 does not in any way consist of insurance, but is merely a levy that is paid into the Unsatisfied Judgment fund, established some years ago.

Pamphlets are available at agent's offices throughout Ontario explaining the demerit system going into force, and all motorists are urged to obtain this pamphlet and give it careful study. Locally plates will go on sale Friday morning, by the agent, Mrs. L. M. Clark, 20 John Street West. The licence bureau will be open all day Friday and Saturday of this week.
